3/4 cup sugar.
1 cup nuts.
Mix sugar and egg yolks. Mix flour and baking powder, and add to dates and nuts, then mix with sugar and egg yolks. Spread in shallow pan, sprinkle lightly with cinnamon. Bake at 300 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes. Do not overbake. Serves 10.

A Few Hints
If you get a fruit stain on your tablecloth, try rubbing the stain with a piece of bread which has been dampened with water. You can stimulate the growth of geraniums by mixing coffee grounds into the soil.

Sprinkle a little sugar on pork roast for a richly browned and savory crust. Before hanging pictures, make paper cutouts the size of the picture and tape to the wall to arrange. Saves unnecessary nail holes.
