Cookies that travel become more and more important this time of year. A box of Mamma's cookies seems to help cure the home-sickness that is bound to develop about eight to 10 days after that son or daughter goes off to school.

These recipes have only two steps in the preparation and each makes a big pan of bar cookies. They are rich moist cookies that stay fresh even though it takes them several days to get to their destination. Even the frosting is easy to mix and is as packable as the cookies. Don't worry about the cookies going stale after they arrive.

You know, "come over to my room, I got a box of home."

Peanut Crunch Bars
 ½ cup shortening.
 1 cup packed brown sugar.
 1 cup flour.
 ½ teaspoon soda.
 ½ teaspoon baking powder.
 2 eggs.
 3 tablespoons water.
 1 teaspoon vanilla.
 1 cup corn flakes.
 1 cup Spanish peanuts.
 ½ cup oatmeal.

Combine shortening, sugar, flour, soda, baking powder, eggs, water and vanilla. Beat for two minutes. Fold in corn flakes, peanuts and oatmeal. Spread evenly in greased 13 by nine by two inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees 20 to 25 minutes. Spread when cool with orange frosting.

Pumpkin Nut Bars
 ½ cup shortening.
 1 cup packed brown sugar.
 ½ teaspoon soda.
 ½ teaspoon baking powder.
 1 teaspoon cinnamon.
 ¼ teaspoon ginger.
 ¼ teaspoon nutmeg.
 2/3 cup pumpkin (cooked or canned).
 2 eggs.
 1 teaspoon vanilla.
 ½ cup chopped nuts.
 Combine all ingredients except nuts in large mixer bowl. Beat for two minutes with electric mixer at medium speed. Fold in nuts. (Black walnuts are great for these). Spread in 13 by nine by two inch pan. Bake at 350 degrees 20 to 25 minutes. Spread when cool with orange frosting.

Orange Frosting
 Blend until smooth two tablespoons shortening, one

and one-half cups powdered sugar, one tablespoon grated orange peel and two tablespoons fresh orange juice. Makes about one cupful.

Mrs. Bessie Goble of Stony Point makes this wonderful White Chocolate Cake which we'd like to try sometime soon if we could just find white chocolate in our market. It seems a friend sends Mrs. Goble the chocolate from Ohio and this cake is a favorite in her house.

If you can find the chocolate, here is a good recipe to try. Clip it and keep it until the white chocolate is available.

White Chocolate Cake
 ¼ lb. white chocolate pieces.
 ½ cup boiling water.
 2 cups sugar.
 1 cup butter (two sticks).
 4 eggs.
 2½ cups cake flour.
 1 teaspoon baking powder.

Melt chocolate in boiling water and let cool to room temperature. Cream butter and sugar. Beat in eggs one at a time until well blended. Add chocolate and vanilla. Sift flour with baking powder and add to first mixture alternately with the buttermilk in four or five additions. Beat just

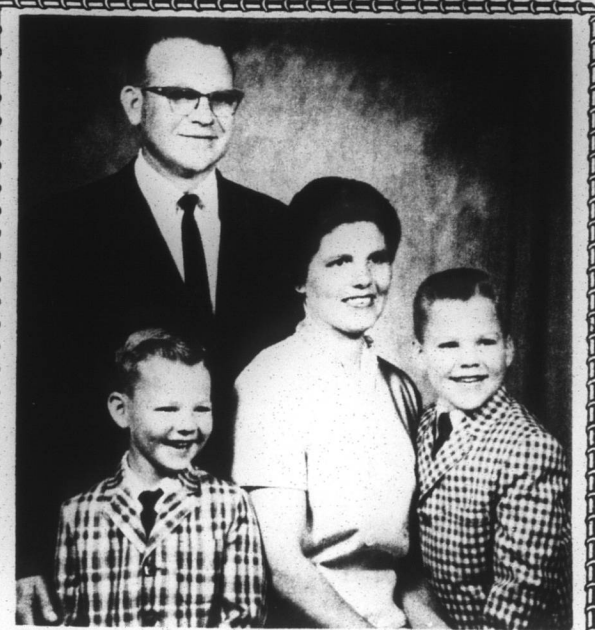

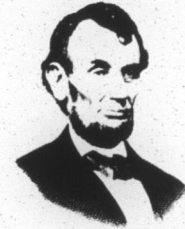
