You must have a jack-o-lantern Setting at your front door, When the goblins come to your home, You'll pass goodies out to them once more.

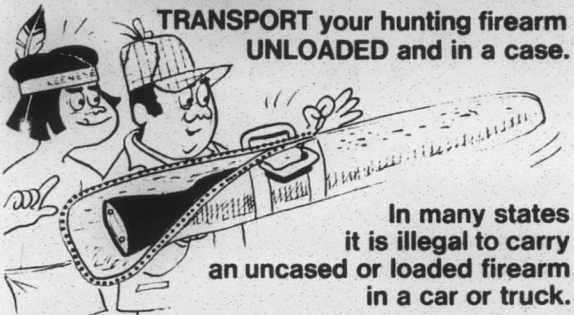
Around the corner now and then You see goblins holding hands; Some are low and others tall, They play pranks I've been told.

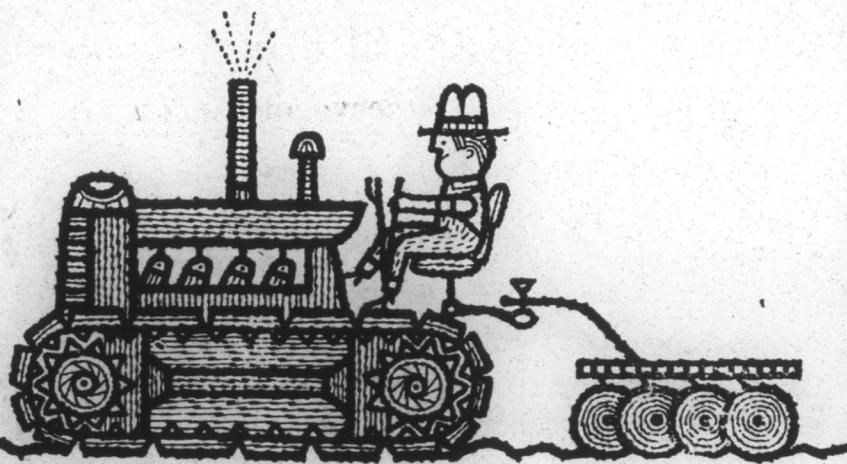
