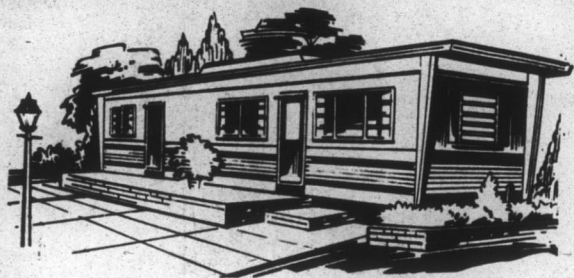

They were loyal to the church like me and you.

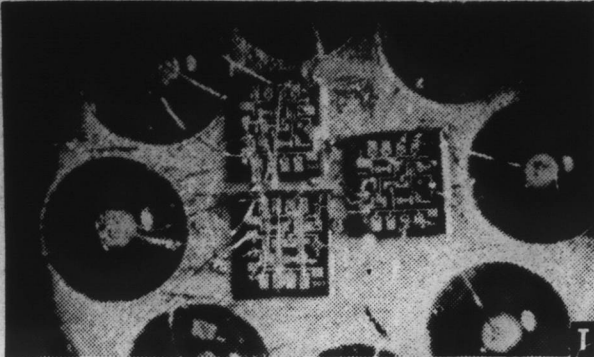
Way back there in the days of old,

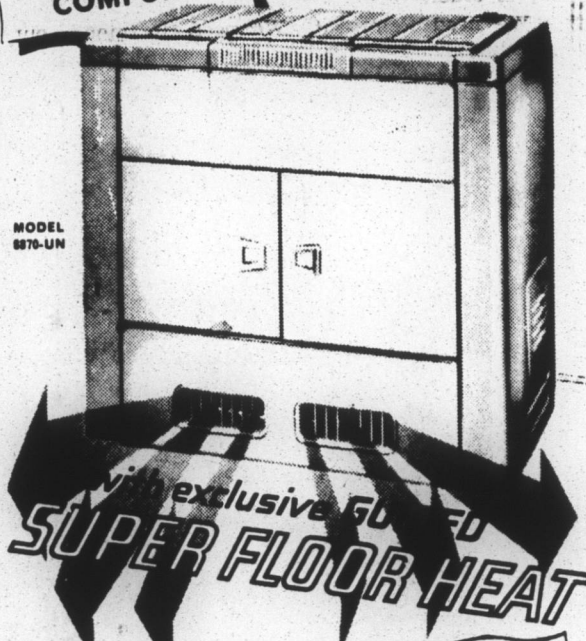

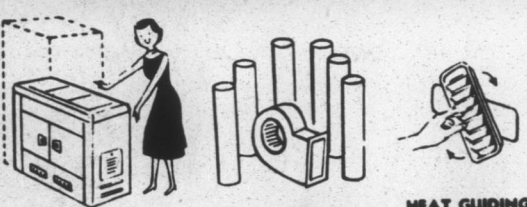
