

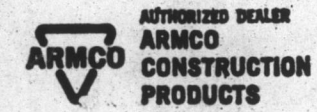
### Sutton Shines In Bear Victory

RALEIGH — Gov. Bob Scott has proclaimed the week of November 2-8 "North Carolina Symphony Week."

In proclaiming the week-long observance, Gov. Scott called the N. C. Symphony "one of the finest symphonies in the nation."

"The five million people of our great state have the opportunity to enjoy music at its highest level due to the presence of this respected orchestra," Gov. Scott said.

The governor's proclamation praised the Symphony for its years of service to the Tar Heel state, citing more than 200,000 miles of travel and over 2,800 con-

certs given in a quarter-century of statewide touring.
