However, I do want you to have this recipe for Prune Cake, given to me by Myrtle Cuthrell, who also brought me a good sized sample, and it is delicious.

Prune Sake

- 1 1/2 cups sugar.
- 1 cup vegetable oil.
- 3 eggs.
- 2 cups sifted flour.
- 1 teaspoon soda.
- 1 teaspoon cinnamon.
- 1 teaspoon vanilla.
- 1 teaspoon nutmeg.
- 1 teaspoon allspice.
- 1/4 teaspoon salt.
- 1 cup buttermilk.
- 1 cup chopped nuts.
- 1 cup cooked pitted and chopped prunes.

Blend sugar and oil. Add eggs, one at a time, and mix well. Add vanilla. Sift flour with soda, spices and salt. Add to egg mixture alternately with buttermilk, blending well after each addition. Add nuts and prunes. Pour into greased pan. Bake one hour at 350 degrees.

Icing For Prune Cake

- 1 cup sugar.
- 1 teaspoon vanilla.
- 1/2 cup buttermilk.
- 1/2 teaspoon salt.
- 1/2 teaspoon soda.
- 1 stick margarine.

Let come to a boil. Set aside. As soon as cake comes from oven pour part of mixture over cake and let set in pan 20 minutes. Turn out of pan and put remaining mix on rest of cake.
