**Fresh Strawberry Cake**  
1 pkg. Betty Crocker white cake mix.

1 pkg. strawberry jello.  
2 tbsp. flour.  
½ box fresh or frozen strawberries, mashed.  
½ cup oil.  
½ cup water.  
Mix well all ingredients, adding the strawberries last. Bake in two 9-inch layer pans at 350 degrees until spring back.

**Icing**  
¼ cube butter.  
½ box of strawberries, mashed.

1 box powdered sugar.  
Cream together and ice cake when cool.  
Serves 12 to 14.

all at once to flour mixture, stirring only until flour is moistened. Fill greased muffin cups two-thirds full. Bake at 425 degrees for 20 to 25 minutes, or until golden brown. Cool slightly before removing from the pan. Makes 12 medium muffins.

### Quickies

**Oriental Butterfly Muffins:** For extra flavor and a decorative touch, mix in one tablespoon grated orange rind to your basic muffin batter. Fill greased muffin cups and place two mandarin orange sections on each muffin in opposite directions, forming butterfly. Bake.

**Savory Biscuit Pinwheels:** Make tasty appetizers by separating biscuits from a package of refrigerator biscuit dough. Roll out each to a rectangle. Cover with one teaspoon each catsup and grated Parmesan cheese. Sprinkle with oregano or caraway seeds; top with chopped mushrooms. Starting at the short end, roll up in jelly-roll fashion. Cut into one-inch slices. Place pinwheels on ungreased baking sheet and bake at 400 degrees for nine to 11 minutes or until brown. Makes about 40 appetizers.

**Tart 'N Tangy**—Add one tablespoon each of freshly-grated lemon rind and poppy-seed to muffin batter. Bake as usual.

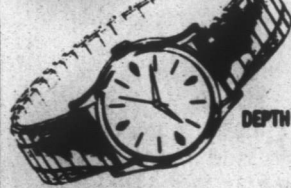

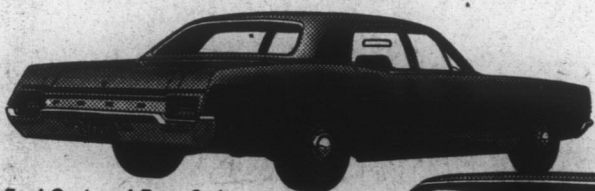

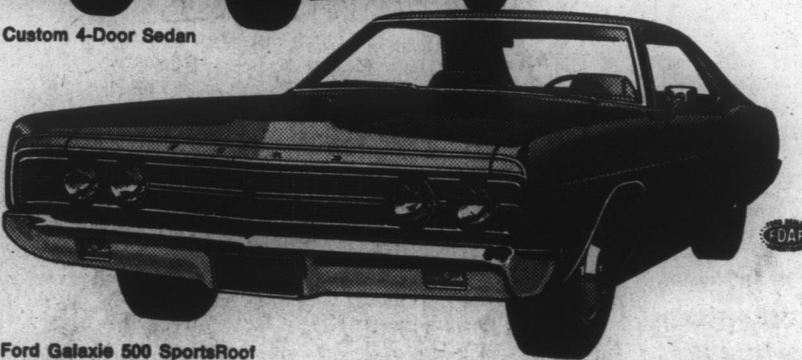
