The "up drugs," pep pills also called "bennies" and "speed," are a group of drugs They form one-half of what is perhaps the biggest part of the drug abuse problem in the U. S. today.

The other half of the problem are the dewn drugs sedatives, sleeping pills, the large family of drugs made for medical purposes to relax a person.

What do the "down drugs"

They produce a relaxing effect for most people; in nor-mal, medically supervised doses, they mildly depress the action of the nerves, skeletal muscles and heart muscle. In abnormal doses, the effects resemble alcoholic drunkenness.

Are these drugs addicting? The amphetamines or "up drugs" produce "psychologi-cal" dependence — a practice


