you should file your claim for Medicare even if monthly checks are not payable. It is also possible that some of your social security checks might be payable even though you are still working. You should discuss your situation in more detail with the people in your social security office.

Q. I read that a 19-yearold boy qualified for disability benefits. How can this be? I understood you had to have five years work credits to qualify for disability payments
