





Horsie Carriers

We all know about horseless carriages, but few, if any, have given thought to the "horsie carriers" before our time ....

These, of course, were the ferryboats which plied the vast sound waters and rivers between the water-oriented towns of the Albemarle Area. They were performing their important communications task even before the

One of the best-known of these was Mackeys Ferry. It was established in 1735, succeeding Bell's Ferry over Al-bemarle Sound. It's northern terminus was in Edenton.

Oh, yes! It carried horseless carriages, too — until operations ceased in 1938.
