Senator Jordan Reports:

WASHINGTON — Property will begin at 40c for each owners in at least some areas \$100 of insurance, with the of North Carolina are going to be able to buy hurricane and flood damage protection this year under a federal insurance program set up through provisions of the 1969 Housing Act.

The coverage will be available on an emergency basis until the end of 1971 while a permanent insurance program is being drafted and prepared for implementation.

Under this arrangement the policies will be sold, however, only in areas which meet federal requirements for land use and land management designed to cut down on future hurricane and flood losses.

Eligibility will be determined by the Federal Insurance Administration, Department of Housing and Urban Development, on the basis of applications from city and county governments and a review of their land-management proposals.

Nine communities in the state have already submitted proposals to FIA under the emergency plan with Greensboro expected to get approval in early April as the first North Carolina participant in the program.

Other areas whose applications are in various stages of FIA review include Charlotte, Wrightsville Beach, Asheville, Buncombe County, New Hanover County, Marshall, Durham and Summit Beach.

In certified areas, a property owner will be able to insure a single family dwelling up to a maximum of \$17,500, with an additional maximum of \$5,000 to cover its contents, and two to four family homes may be covered to a maximum of \$30,000 with \$5,000 in protection for the contents of each dwelling unit.

Notice is hereby given that a special election will be held in the Town of Edenton, North Carolina, on the 2nd day of May, 1970, for the purpose of submitting the question whether the qualified voters of said Town shall approve the indebtedness to be incurred by the issuance of bonds of said Town of the maximum principal amount of \$375,000 to finance, together with any other funds which may be made available therefor, the extension, improvement and enlargement of the system maintained by the Town to provide a supply of water to said Town and its inhabitants by the construction of water treatment facilities, facilities providing for an increased supply of water, water storage facilities and the extension of water lines, including the acquisition and installation of the equipment, machinery and apparatus required therefor and the acquisition of the necessary lands or rights-in-land, and a tax to be levied for the payment therefor, and also the bond ordinance adopted by the Board of Councilmen of said Town on March 2, 1970, which authorizes the issuance of said bonds for such purpose and the levy of such tax, and the question whether the qualified voters of said Town shall approve the indebtedness to be incurred by the issuance of bonds of said Town of the maximum principal amount of \$225,000 to finance the extension, improvement, and enlargement of the sanitary sewer system maintained and operated by the Town for the collection and disposal of sewage by the extension of sewer lines, including the acquisition and installation of the equipment, machinery and apparatus required therefor and the acquisition of the necessary lands or rights-in-land, and a tax to be levied for the payment thereof, and also the bond ordinance adopted by the Board of Councilmen of said Town on March 2, 1970, which authorizes the issuance of said bonds for such purpose and the levy of such tax.

The ballots to be used at said election shall contain the words "FOR/AGAINST" the ordinance authorizing \$375,000 of bonds to finance the extension, improvement and enlargement of the system maintained by the Town to provide a supply of water to said Town and its inhabitants by the construction of water treatment facilities, facilities providing for an increased supply of water, water storage facilities and the extension of water lines, including the acquisition and installation of the equipment, machinery and apparatus required therefor and the acquisition of the necessary lands or rights-in-land, and a tax therefor" and the words "FOR/AGAINST" the ordinance authorizing \$225,000 of

bonds to finance the extension, improvement, and enlargement of the sanitary sewer system maintained and operated by the Town for the collection and disposal of sewage by the extension of sewer lines, including the acquisition and installation of the equipment, machinery and apparatus required therefor and the acquisition of the necessary lands or rights-in-land, and a tax therefor" with squares beside the words "FOR" and "AGAINST" in which squares the voter may make an (X) mark to indicate his choice.

In the event that the qualified voters approve the indebtedness to be incurred by the issuance of said bonds and the tax therefor and said ordinances, the bonds authorized by said ordinances will be issued for the purposes stated and an annual tax sufficient to pay the principal of and interest on said bonds will be levied.

The polls for said election will open at the hour of 6:30 o'clock A. M., and will close at the hour of 6:30 o'clock P. M. Every person offering to vote, must be a legally registered voter.

The polling place which has been designated for each polling precinct and the persons who have been appointed to act as Registrar and Judges of Election in each such precinct are as follows:

Precinct: West Edenton; polling place, Municipal Building; Registrar, Jamsey Hicks; Judges of Election, Rcebud Curran and Angela Wright.

Precinct: East Edenton; polling place, Court House; Registrar, Juanita Cozzens; Judges of Election, Iris Mills and Willard Rhoades.

Precinct: Yeopim; polling place, Edenton Municipal Airport; Registrar, Betsy Hassell; Judges of Election, Alice Twiddy and R. R. Barnes.

Precinct: Rocky Hook; polling place, Rocky Hook Community Center; Registrar, Bessie Peele; Judges of Election, Earl Bunch and Paul Ober.

Precinct: Center Hill; polling place, Center Hill Community Building; Registrar, Ralph Goodwin; Judges of Election, Rufus Smithson and Norman Hollowell.

Precinct: Wardville; polling place, H & H Grocery Store; Registrar, H. R. Peele; Judges of Election, W. J. Bunch and Clara Henderson.

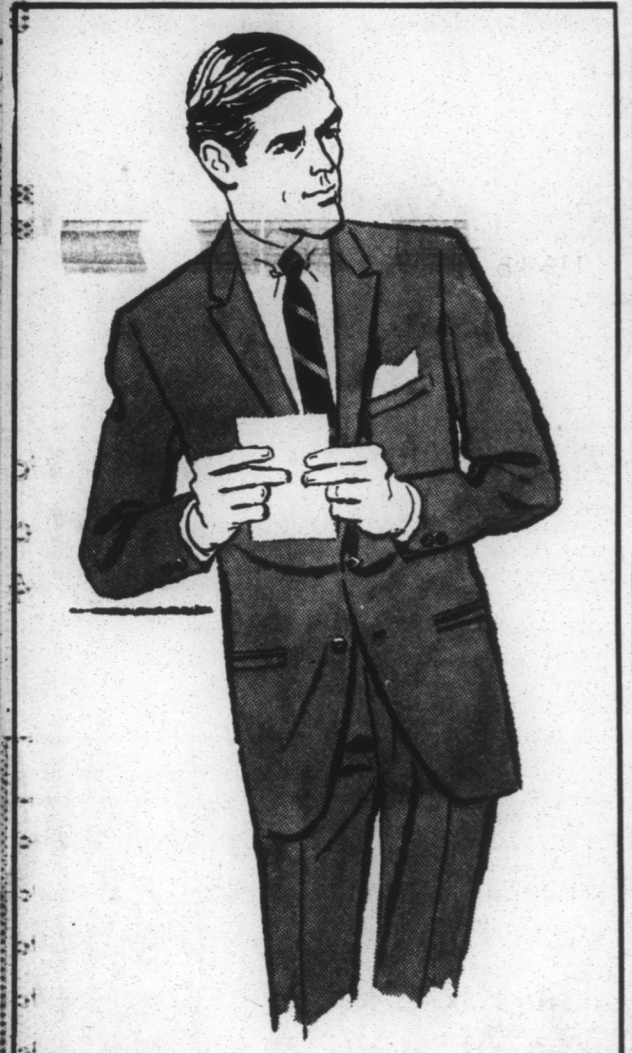

We all know about horseless carriages, but few, if any, have given thought to the "horsie carriers" before our time...

These, of course, were the ferryboats which plied the vast sound waters and rivers between the water-oriented towns of the Albemarle Area. They were performing their important communications task even before the Revolution.

One of the best-known of these was Mackey's Ferry. It was established in 1735, succeeding Bell's Ferry over Albemarle Sound. It's northern terminus was in Edenton.

Oh, yes! It carried horseless carriages, too — until operations ceased in 1938.
