### Southern Life Report Released

Insurance in force of Southern Life Insurance Co., grew 5 per cent in 1969 to a year-end total of \$577,800,115, according to W. L. Carter, Jr., president, in releasing the company's annual report. Figures from the report show an insurance-in-force gain of \$31,625,000, excluding the \$3,839,000 decrease in the \$70,066,000 total servicemen's group life insurance in force. Total sales were listed at \$106,763,185 for the year with \$4,080,553 paid in benefits to policyowners and beneficiaries, raising the accumulated total to \$44,460,886 in benefits paid.

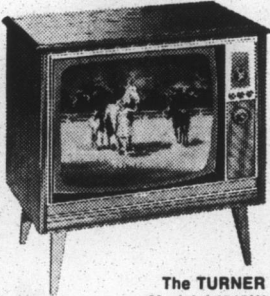

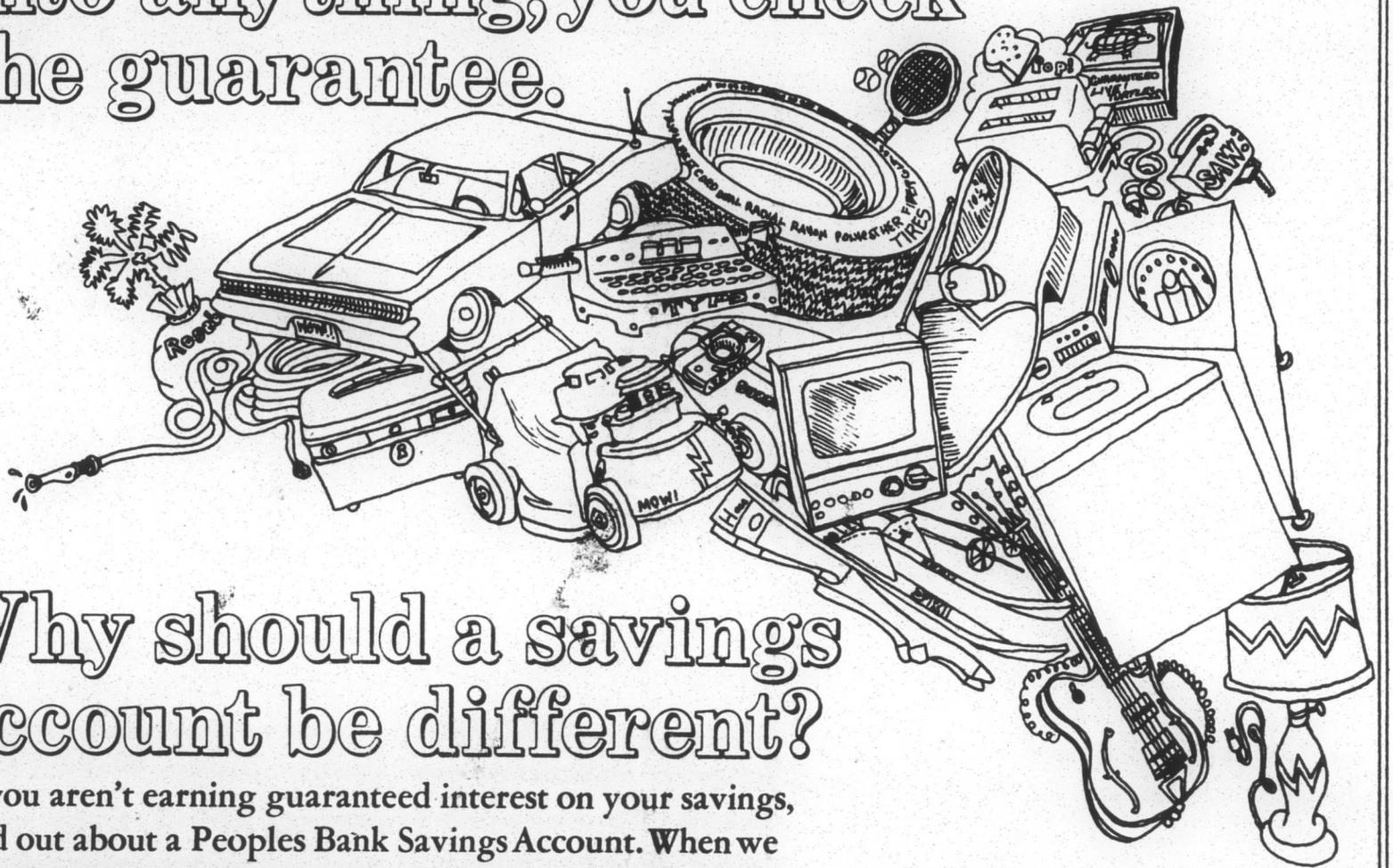
