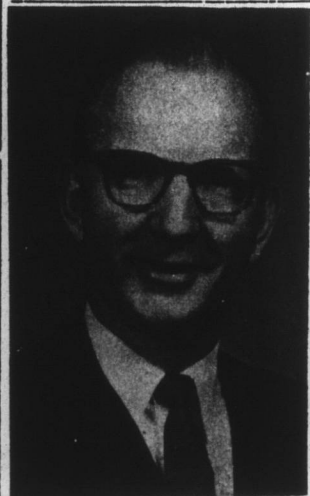

Circuit Official Visiting In Area

Wendell G. Shawver, circuit supervisor for Jehovah's Witnesses in Eastern North Carolina, is in Edenton this week visiting the local congregation. He will deliver a free public lecture at 10 A. M. at the Kingdom Hall on U. S. 17 (North) entitled "Education That Equips You For Life."

"Mr. Shawver spoke to the local congregation Tuesday night at a special session of the ministry school and service meeting outlining the week's activity. This will include house-to-house visits to Edenton homes with brief sermons discussing what the changes taking place in religion today mean for Christians.

"Throughout the world, church organizations are being torn by internal disputes," said Mr. Shawver. "In many areas church attendance has sagged so much that some churches resort to 'rock' music, dancing and other entertainment to bolster it. What is worse, some churchmen are excusing adultery, homosexuality and other loose conduct."

"Although this may not be true in all areas, its increase is reason enough for all of us to examine our faith to be sure it is well founded on the truth of the Bible and strong enough to stand up under tests that are certain to come," he added.

In the ministry since 1934, Mr. Shawver has been a special representative of the Watchtower Society for nearly 25 years. Originally from West Virginia, he and his wife Grace have traveled from Canada to Florida in the ministry. They visited Edenton briefly in 1960 and said they have looked forward to returning to the area.

In addition to the public lecture Sunday, Mr. Shawver will speak at the local Kingdom Hall at 8 o'clock Thursday and Saturday nights. The public is invited to attend all meetings throughout the week.
