It has been brought to my attention that members of your organization conducted a search which successfully culminated in the rescue of two coast guardsmen who became stranded on a buoy they were servicing when their boat drifted away in high winds on the afternoon of 15 April, 1970.

The situation could have been a lot more serious in that both men were lightly clad when the incident occurred, and darkness was fast approaching, with temperatures in the low 40's, winds 25 to 30 miles an hour, and visibility extremely limited.

Please express my sincerest appreciation to everyone who participated in the execution of this mission which reflected so favorably upon not only those individuals directly involved, but also the entire community of Edenton, N. C.

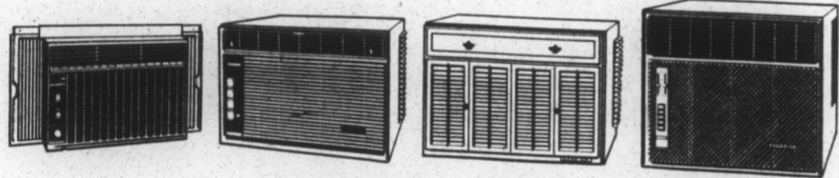
