Spencer Joins First National

JACKSONVILLE — John C. Spencer has been named vice president in charge of operations for all the 33 branches of the \$100-million First National Bank of Eastern North Carolina, it was announced at the bank's central office in Jacksonville today.

J. Hugh Rich, president of the system which operates in 21 cities from the Tennessee line to the coast, said Spencer also will serve on a five-man management executive committee which directs every phase of the bank's activities. Spencer formerly was vice president and cashier of the \$120-million Birmingham Bloomfield Bank in Birmingham, Mich., having assumed the number two position in management when that bank had assets of only \$17-million in 1965.

Prior to joining the Birmingham bank, Spencer spent nine years with the \$20-million Livonia, Mich., National Bank, where he rose from management trainee to assistant vice president. In that capacity he was in charge of operating personnel, advertising, business development, purchasing and installment loans.

Immediately before joining First National he was executive vice president of a bank management consulting and recruiting firm in New York City.

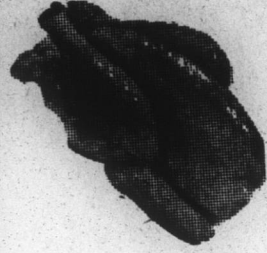
