Here is a recipe for Coconut Custard Pie sent to me by Mrs. Esther Harrell of Suffolk, Va.:

2 cups sugar.

2 tbs. flour.
1/2 tsp. baking powder.
3 eggs well beaten.
2 cups milk.
1/2 cup butter.
1 tsp. vanilla.
1 can (4-oz.) coconut.
2 unbaked 8-inch pie shells.
Mix together sugar, flour, baking powder. Add eggs, milk, butter and vanilla. Sprinkle coconut over bottom of pie shells. Pour half of custard mixture into each shell. Bake in 350 degree oven one hour or until slightly browned. Makes two 8-inch pies.

A Few Hints
Paper towels at bottom of vegetable bins will absorb moisture and keep vegetables crisp.
