M' Cleney - Arnold Vows

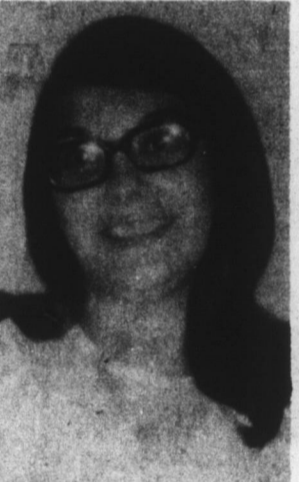
