

Around Chowan Farms

The Peanut Field Day will be held in Lewiston Thursday, September 10. The general meeting will start at 10 A. M. with Dr. Pugh of Wachovia Bank & Trust Company. Lunch will be available at 12. The afternoon session will be demonstrations in the field which will include showing different makes of inverter diggers. This is a wonderful opportunity for the peanut farmers to get together with farmers from other areas and discuss different problems plus a chance to talk to manufacturers of equipment used in peanut production. All peanut farmers and people interested in peanuts are invited to attend.

Peanuts in Chowan County on the whole look good, even though there are problems with red spider in some places and corn ear worms eating the foliage. The corn ear worms are also present in soybeans. A good application of insecticide usually gives control to the ear worm in the case of red spider, dusting with either Ethion or Sulfur will give some control. We believe that continuing with the copper sulfur on peanuts is very important in order to control leaf spot and this will help to control the red spider. Late applications of copper sulfur or of some

fungicide on peanuts is usually best as it keeps the leaves on the plant and helps to prevent shedding of the peanuts.

In the case of the corn—we are suggesting that you harvest your corn as fast as possible, even though the moisture may be higher than you like to pick it. If you are storing the corn, we urge you to dry it down to about 14 per cent moisture so that if there is some toxin in the blight, it will not grow at this moisture probably. We also urge you to bury the corn stalks after harvesting so that the corn stalk borer will not be able to hatch out and there is a good possibility that the disease will not overwinter if the stalk is completely covered with soil. These are two good reasons to bury the stubble and we would like to see it done on a county-wide basis because it is not near as effective unless everyone follows this practice.

Remember the Chowan County Fair—September 21-26. If you have exhibits for the fair, be sure and get them entered.

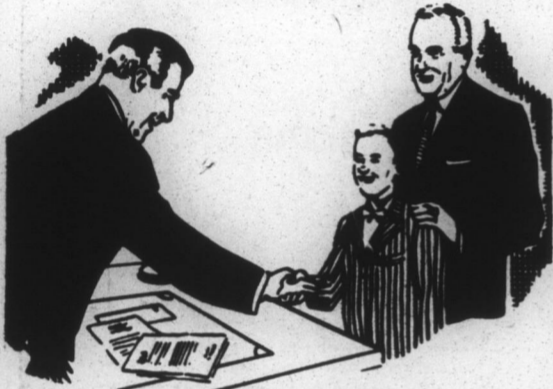

The week ending August 21 saw the U. S. House of Representatives still in the numerical degree of integration. During the recess I have had the pleasure of visiting many parts of the Congressional District. I find that our citizens are still gravely concerned as to school enrollment practices being forced upon them by this administration and federal courts. Certainly Friday, August 28, I had there is no reason or justification in forcing the small children of both races to travel

great distances merely to achieve some hypothetical degree of integration. In spite of Attorney General Mitchell's advocacy of the "neighborhood concept," the practices of the Department of Justice and the HEW are quite different and belie the promises and statements of many in high places of this administration. Certainly Friday, August 28, I had the pleasure of greeting the Ambassador from Great Britain, the Honorable John Freeman, and welcoming him to the First District at which time he made an official visit to Dare County to view "The Lost Colony" pageant, and later to visit Ocracoke Island and the graves of the British sailors who were killed off the North Carolina coast during the Second World War. The Ambassador was high in his praise of the "Outer Banks." More and more this section of our state is becoming a major tourist attraction. Our office in Washington has directed several members of Congress and their families to the eastern shore of the First District for vacations, all of whom have been very lavish in their praise. Certainly for the First District, as well as all North Carolina, tourism is becoming a major industry. Congress will finish this summer recess on September 8 with no prediction in sight as of now as to the final date of the sine die adjournment.
