COA Workshop Planned

The College of the Albemarle in conjunction with its Health Grant Project will begin a series of five In-Service Education Workshops on campus at COA for registered nurses, health directors, practical nurses, nurses aides and other health personnel of Pasquotank, Perquimans, Chowan, Camden, Currituck, Gates and Dare on September 14, and scheduled throughout the year. It is the objective of these workshops to update knowledge, skills and understandings of health problems for health personnel.

Each workshop is designed for three hours of instruction in the morning and repeated in the afternoon session. The first workshop on Sep-

tember 14 will be on Drug Abuse. Dr. David R. Work, assistant professor of pharmacy administration, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill and Charles C. Pullman, instructor of clinical pharmacy, University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, will conduct the workshop.

In addition, beginning on September 28, and scheduled throughout the year, there will be five workshops for approximately 22 community leaders of Pasquotank, Perquimans, Chowan, Gates, Currituck, Camden and Dare counties. At these workshops each community leader will receive information and materials on the same topics covered in the workshops for the professional health personnel. This will enable professional personnel to assist community leaders in presenting information and materials to the people at the community seminars which the community leaders will conduct in their respective communities.

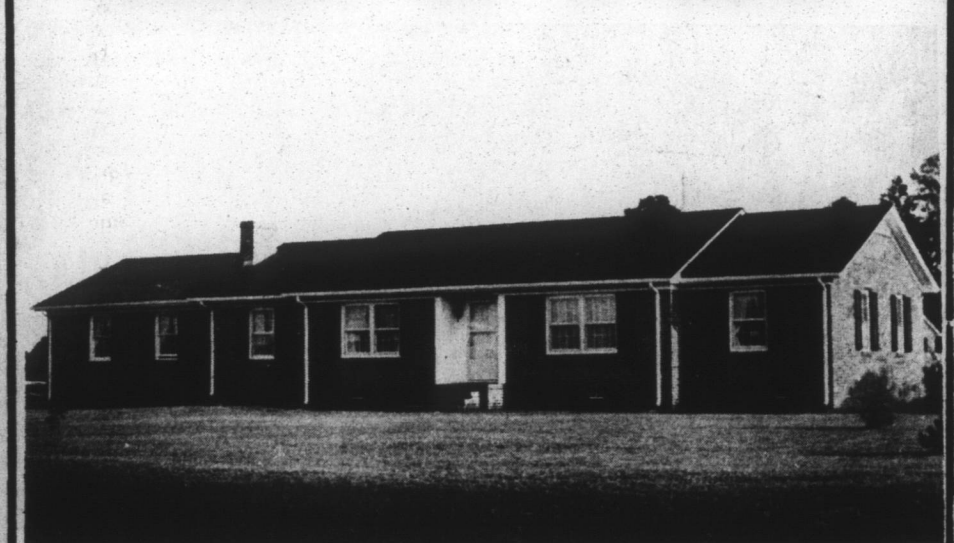


