Cancer Crusade

"We're out to tell people that it's what they don't know about cancer that can hurt. We mean to instruct them in personal ways of protecting themselves against cancer," he

The emphasis is on action in the 1970 Crusade.

Volunteers in Chowan County will be marshalled to bring home the message - "Fight Cancer with a Checkup and a Check".

The crusade has a triple aim this October. First, to encourage every member of the community to have a regular health checkup, including cancer tests. Second, to teach people pro-

ctive measures ag cer. By that is meant personal action, for example, the use of caution in the sun to avoid skin cancer. Another example is quite famous-an end to cigarette smoking to prevent most lung cancer.

Third, to raise the money to support vital ACS programs of research, education and service to cancer patients. "We look to the laboratories for the final solution to the cancer problem," Mr. Norvell said. "Today there are 1.5 million Americans alive and cured of cancer. What tomorrow may bring depends on the imagination and expertise of scientists and the support of us all."
