Bunch Manager At Mount Olive

JACKSONVILLE — William H. Bunch last week was elected assistant vice presi- dent and manager of the Mount Olive branch of First National Bank of Eastern North Carolina.

The action was taken by First National's central board of directors at its monthly meeting in Jacksonville.

J. Hugh Rich, president of the \$135-million system which has 37 branches in 23 cities across the state, said Bunch is replacing Carl D. Lewis, who has transferred to the bank's central office to work in credit administration.
