His winning recipe was: **Barbecue Shoulder Slices**

**Sauce:**  
2 cups vinegar,  
8 oz. can tomato sauce with onions,  
2 tablespoons Texas Pete Hot Sauce.

1 tablespoon salt,  
1 tablespoon black pepper,  
1/2 teaspoon red pepper,  
1/4 cup Wesson Oil.

In heavy saucpan combine ingredients and let simmer for 10 minutes. Charcoal reaches desired temperature place pork slices on grill until it browns on both sides. Then coat each slice with prepared sauce. (Use basting brush). Continue cooking with basting until pork is well done. Approximately 1 1/2 hours depending on thick-

ness of cut. In addition to a cash award of \$75 Belch won an electric clock for his efforts.

He was declared Pork Cookout Champ in the Chowan County Fair and proceeded to acquire himself extremely well by placing fourth among the 15 finalists in the state event in Raleigh. It was one of the most colorful events of the entire fair that attracted throngs of people attracted to the odor and sight of barbecuing pork on the lawn adjacent to the Education Building.

Judges for the event were Mrs. Peggy Mann, Woman's Editor, WTVD Channel 11, Durham, John Christian, Food Science Specialist, N. C. State University, Raleigh, Charlie Slate, Carolina Radio Network, Wilson, and Dick White, vice president N. C. Pork Producers Association, Selma.

Dennis and Louette Monds served refreshments which everyone enjoyed and the group was dismissed.

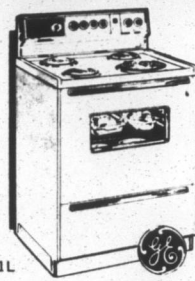
