Vibrations Sew Without Needles

Even the most modest young lady will be able to appear in public without a stitch on!

Sewing without needle or thread, the Ultrasonic Sewing Machine can be used to hem, tack base, pleat, seam, slit and buttonhole.

Developed by Branson Sonic Power Company, of Danbury, Connecticut, this high-technology product limits its present application to industrial markets. The new technique sews by welding together synthetic materials with ultrasonic (high frequency) vibrations. The vibrations generate localized heat by causing one piece of material to vibrate against the other, creating a molecular change which joins—or "sews"—the pieces together.

Residents Benefit From Food Stamps

Bonus food stamps for those participating in this program of the Chowan County Department of Social Services continued to be on a larger than 2-1 ratio during October, according to a report issued Monday by Director Robert Hendrix.

In his monthly report to county commissioners, Hendrix said 179 families were certified for participation in the food stamp program. The 171 who purchased the stamps paid \$5,251 and received stamps valued at \$16,424.

The report also showed the following:

- Aid to Aged: 90 cases, \$4,653 grant; \$51.70 average.
- Aid to Dependent Children: 78 cases, \$7,235 grant; \$20.17 average.
- Aid to Disabled: 41 cases, \$2,236 grant; \$54.53 average.
- Aid to Blind: 14 cases, \$750 grant, \$54.21 average.

Twenty-five hospitalized in the county at a total cost of \$3,805.45; \$746.65 county funds and \$3,058.80 joint funds.

Two hospitalized outside the county at a total cost of \$2,355.93; \$18 county funds and \$2,337.93 joint funds.

Thirty-three out-patient services, \$882.46 joint funds. There were 175 pharmacy bills which totaled \$1,861.90 from joint funds; 11 dental bills, \$807 from joint funds and 124 physician services, \$3,134.90; \$20 county funds and \$3,114.90 joint funds.

Eleven nursing home cases at a cost of \$3,516.60 from joint funds and 15 optical services, \$372.90 from joint funds.

Idle Hands Could Aid In Special Children's Program

Time on your hands? N. C. signed to find area people to Association for Retarded Children is interested in acquiring some of it. This is the reason for a survey of the professional persons willing to provide services in the community," she states.

The association, aided by a grant of \$35,000 from the N. C. Department of Mental Health, has set out to catalog professional persons who are presently inactive. They want to know if these people are interested in working with retarded children.

Miss Barbara Well, a special education teacher from Florida, is conducting the study. She points out that association is not just seeking teachers, nurses, etc., but any type professional person who can be helpful.

The entire program is designed to find area people to aid in a program to get some of the retarded children out of institutions and back into the community environment. This can only be done by professional persons willing to provide services in the community," she states.

The big problem area is lack of professional guidance. North Carolina has four institutions with a total of 5,000 beds. It is estimated that there are more than 150,000 retarded children in this state—some 300 of them probably in Chowan County. Many of those in institutions could return home if services were available, thereby making space available for those now in the community who should be in an institution but cannot because of lack of space.

New programs to be considered are work activity centers, adult activity centers and day care centers for all ages. "These programs must be established in order for our communities to provide positive alternatives to residential care," she states.

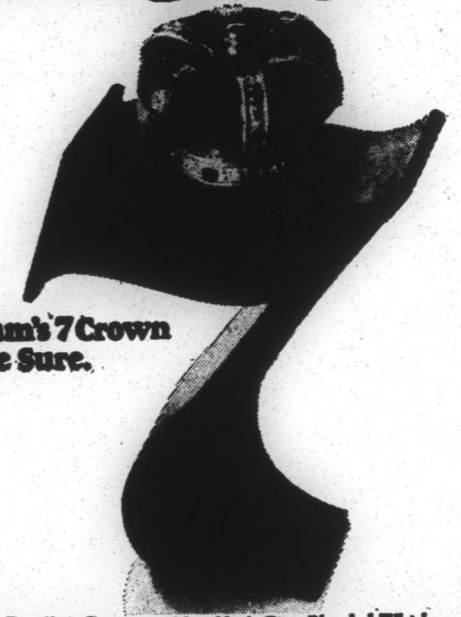
Actual survey work began in Northeastern North Carolina Monday and Miss Wells hopes to wind up the bulk of her work within two weeks so she can move to another area.
