

Minutes Of Board Of County Commissioners Month Of Nov.

The Board of County Commissioners met in regular session Monday, November 2, 1970 at 9 o'clock A. M., with all members present: J. Clarence Leary, chairman, C. A. Phillips, C. M. Evans, David T. Bateman and N. J. George.

Mr. Thompson in giving his agricultural extension service report invited the Commissioners to a demonstration opening of the low cost building on Hicks Street November 26. He also invited them to a 20-county swine seminar to be held November 10 at the American Legion Hut starting at 10 A. M.

Murray Ashley, Civil Defense director, told the Commissioners of a plan for survival. Upon motion of N. J. George, seconded by C. M. Evans and unanimously carried that the printing of the plan be approved without cost to the county. Mr. Ashley reported that federal funds are available for constructing an emergency operations center.

George Lewis, chairman of the County Planning Board, invited the Commissioners to attend their meetings held in the conference room on the second floor in the county office building the fourth Tuesday of each month. He invited them to a special meeting to be held November 9.

Mr. Lewis requested a budget of \$300.00 for this year for seminars and other expenses of the Board.

Upon motion of C. A. Phillips, seconded by David T. Bateman and unanimously carried that \$300.00 be set up for use by the County Planning Board.

On motion by David T. Bateman, seconded by C. M. Evans and unanimously carried that the tax collector be relieved of the following taxes: Property sold to the Edenton Housing Authority; R. P. Upon motion of David T. Bateman, seconded by C. M. Evans and unanimously carried that Ruth B. Conger be reimbursed for four days unused leave.

Upon motion of C. M. Evans, seconded by David T. Bateman and unanimously carried that pick-up taxes in the amount of \$170.75 be charged to the tax collector.

Upon motion of C. A. Phillips, seconded by David T. Bateman and unanimously carried that Representative

W. T. Chappell be appointed to serve as a member of the Executive Board of Directors.

Upon motion of Commissioner David T. Bateman, seconded by C. M. Evans, the foregoing resolution was passed by the following vote:

Upon motion by C. A. Phillips, seconded by N. J. George and unanimously carried that State Highway Commission be requested to take over the entrance to the drive at Immanuel Baptist Church on Highway 32.

A notice of intention to apply for a beer permit for Wind-Lee Enterprises, Inc., trade name "Zip Mart of Edenton" was approved.

Charles R. Franklin, director of Albemarle Mental Health Center, explained to the Commissioners the 1970-1971 itemized budget. He plans to report to the Board every two months. The name has been changed from the Alcoholic and Mental Health Center to the Mental Health Center.

Upon motion of N. J. George, seconded by C. A. Phillips and unanimously carried that the resolution supporting the construction of a coastal corridor highway through North and South Carolina from Norfolk, Va., to an intersection with Interstate 95 north of Savannah, Ga., be adopted.

The county personnel policy was discussed and the Commissioners agreed on Commissioner George's recommendation that a policy be drawn and become effective January 1, 1971.

After a discussion of the application for a permit by Union Camp Corporation of Franklin, Va., to construct a fence and install additional mooring dolphins in Albemarle Sound near Edenton at Hornblow Point in Chowan County, N. C., a motion was made by C. A. Phillips, seconded by David T. Bateman and unanimously carried that this matter be turned over to the County Planning Board.

The following reports were accepted and ordered filed: Tax collector; county accountant; Department of Social Services; Treasurer; Rescue Squad; Veterans' Service Officer; Coroner; Agricultural Extension Service.

There being no further business, the meeting adjourned.
