Leonard Hardy, Jr., of Raleigh, has been promoted to supervisory contract specialist with the state office of the USDA-Soil Conservation Service, it was announced by State Conservationist Charles W. Bartlett.

In his new capacity Hardy will head the Administrative Services Section. He succeeds Wilson B. Morton, who will retire in December after occupying the position since 1957.

Hardy joined SCS in June, 1965, soon after receiving his B.S. degree in agricultural engineering from A & T State University at Greensboro. Born in Halifax County August 12, 1942, he graduated from Inboden High School in Enfield.

Hardy was first assigned to the Edenton Work Unit of office as a soil conservationist and transferred to similar duties in Fayetteville in January, 1966. He remained in Fayetteville until February, 1969, when he was transferred to the SCS state office in Raleigh as budget analyst, the position he held when he was selected for his current promotion.

He married the former Linda Lee Frazier, and they have two sons.

Yes, everyone has been young, This has been ever since time first begun. We're first a bud and then a bloom, But age crept up on us very soon.

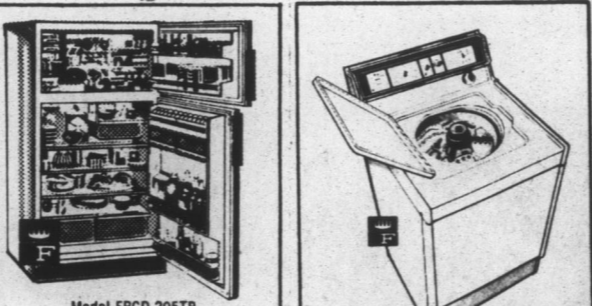
So take a survey every day Of what you do and what you say. And be prepared day or night, If God should call us, what would be our plight?

Social Security Questions-Answers

Q. I receive social security benefits for my daughter who was recently married. Can I report her marriage by telephone or must I report this in person or by letter?

A. The marriage of your daughter can be reported to the social security office by telephone. Events which a beneficiary is required to report can be reported in person or by letter as well as by phone, but the phone call is usually the quickest and easiest way to make these reports.

Q. My husband and I have three young children, and I already know that if he dies the children could get social security payments on his record. I worked several years under social security, but that was before I married. In case of my death, could our children get these payments on my record?

A. Yes—if you worked long enough to be insured, no matter how long ago you stopped working. Your children could receive social security benefits on your record in exactly the same manner as they would on their father's record.
