A computerized system that immediately transmits an individual's complete medical history at an attending physician's request anywhere in the world has been introduced. The system provides medical information of enrolled members on an emergency basis, according to Dr. Ira Greifer, medical director of Computerlife. Brooks noted that the campaign helps finance the outstanding alumni teaching professorships, scholarships, library assistance and other projects of the NCSU Alumni Association. The NCSU Alumni Association represents some 60,000 alumni living in every county of North Carolina, in 40 other states and in dozens of foreign lands. Brooks said intensive efforts have been undertaken to contact every NCSU alumnus in this area by February. Goal of the statewide campaign, he said, is \$125,000 to support teaching, research and extension programs at NCSU.
