**Some Suds**  
The 20-millionth barrel of beer produced by Anheuser-Busch, Inc., in 1970 (each barrel contains 13,777 cases) was bunged on November 25th at 12:15 p.m. by August A. Busch, Jr., president and chairman of the board, at the company's home plant in St. Louis.

The historic production milestone marked Anheuser-Busch as the first single brewing company in the world to produce this volume of beer in one year. The record includes Budweiser, Michelob and Busch Bavarian beer brewed at plants in St. Louis, Newark, Los Angeles, Tampa, Houston, Columbus, O., Jacksonville, Fla., and Merrimack, N. H.

Commenting on the economic impact of this production, Mr. Busch pointed out that in addition to the thousands of jobs the company provides, federal taxes on the 20 million barrels will be \$180,000,000, and approximately \$45,000,000 will be paid in state taxes.
