program compliance. The county ASOS office also provides measurement service at cost, to help producers determine acreages at planting or at certification

"Most producers are familiar with our system of certification, followed by spot checks around the county to verify accuracy of these statements," Griffin said.

"Producers can certify acreages once they complete their planting operations if they do not plan to make any changes. The important thing is to certify accurately and as soon as practical for early payments. But they must remember no changes can be made after certifica-
