Committee Elections

Set Aside Acreage May Be Grazed  
Farmers enrolled in the 1971 set aside programs may

now graze their set aside acreage. No harvesting is permitted at any time during 1971.

Wise use of set aside acreage can be a definite fringe benefit for participating farmers. Many livestock and dairy farmers have utilized set aside acreage very effectively in providing supplementary grazing during the late fall and early spring. Many others take advantage of set aside acreage to install needed conservation measures and rotation systems that are also very beneficial.

### Reminders

1. Commodity loans are available through the ASCS office to purchase storage and drying equipment at a low interest rate.

2. Tobacco marketing cards should be returned to the county office when sales are completed.

3. Peanut marketing cards

have been mailed to all producers and when final sales are completed they should be returned to the county office.

4. Funds are still available to assist farmers in sowing winter cover crops and pastures.

5. Report REAP (ACP) practices as soon as practices are carried out, but no later than November 10, 1971.

6. This office will be closed Monday, October 11 in observance of Columbus Day.
