

Howard Confident In GOP Primary

Mack Howard, Republican candidate for U. S. Congress, was campaigning in Edenton Friday. Howard is an attorney in Greenville.

He is being opposed by Jordan Bonner of Hertford.

Howard stated he is personally convinced that the people in Eastern North Carolina deserve an energetic representative with a main issue being the economy of the state. He also remarked he will work toward a better situation for the small family farmers.

He has been touring the district for three weeks, meeting the citizens and discussing issues.

The candidate stated he

anticipates trouble in the primary but is looking forward to the general election.

Howard commented that he favors the Nixon programs and is in favor of quality education.

He is a native of Deep Run and graduated from high school there, where he was active in high school athletics and farm youth organizations.

He attended the Citadel in Charleston, S. C., where he was a member of the freshman basketball team. Following attendance at Columbia Prep School in Washington, D. C., in 1958, he was appointed to the U. S. Military Academy, West Point, N. Y. He graduated from West Point in 1962 with a B.S. degree.

Following graduation from West Point, Howard was commissioned into the Army Infantry and assigned to Ft. Benning, Ga., where he qualified as a paratrooper and Army ranger. He has served with the Army Infantry in Germany, Hawaii, Thailand, Vietnam, Okinawa and several posts in the States. As a result of Howard's two tours of combat in Vietnam, he was awarded the Silver Star, two Bronze Stars, two Air Medals, the Purple Heart and the Combat Infantryman's Badge.

In 1967 he took a leave of absence from the Army to attend law school at Wake Forest University. He was elected president of the student body at Wake Forest and a member of Phi Alpha Delta legal fraternity. Howard was graduated from Wake Forest Law School with a J.D. degree and admitted to the North Carolina Bar in August, 1970.

Howard is married to the former Eloise Kathleen McInty. They have one daughter, Shannon Lea, who is two years old. Mrs. Howard is

active in work with handicapped children, a Cadette Girl Scout co-leader, Sunday School teacher and choir member.

In Howard's most recent position as legislative counsel to the Secretary of the Army, he acted as adviser to the Army Staff on Congressional matters and conducts liaison between the Department of Army and the U. S. Senate and House of Representatives. President Richard M. Nixon recently awarded Howard under executive order, the Meritorious Service Award for his duties and performance as liaison to the U. S. Congress.

Howard is a member of the N. C. Bar Association, the American Bar Association, Grace Baptist Church in Alexandria, Va., the Regional Advisor for the Scout Citizenship Merit Badge Award. He was formerly a member of the board of directors of University Auditorium of University High School on the ESU campus.

Around Chowan County Farms By R. M. Thompson

On Wednesday, April 5, the North Carolina Pork Producers Association will hold their referendum to assess themselves five cents per head. Every swine producer in Chowan County is eligible to vote. The polling places will be at Morris & Hinton's, Valhalla Produce, Leary Bros. and M. D. Baker Hog Market. In the past two or three years, for the first time in history, the consumption of pork has increased per person by five pounds. As you know, the Pork Producers Association is a promotional organization and the increase in consumption of pork is one of their goals. This referendum in Chowan County is being sponsored by the Chowan County Swine Producers Association and their board of directors are urging everyone who is eligible to vote.

As many of you probably know, there are granular nematicides on the market. We have Mocop, Dasnit and just last week we received

word that Furadan has been released for use on peanuts. These materials can be applied with granular applicators that are mounted on most planters and this operation can be done at the time of planting. If you have any questions on how to apply these materials, please contact us at the County Extension office.

There is hereby imposed a statewide quarantine on the movement, or sale for movement, of all swine except for the purpose of immediate slaughter. This quarantine became effective Saturday, March 4, 1972, and continues in force until revoked.

The sole exemptions to this quarantine order shall be:

1. Swine moving to immediate slaughter. Swine purchased for immediate slaughter shall be identified at the time of purchase by a green paint mark on the back not less than 3x3 inches, except that those swine entering the holding pen of a plant under state or federal meat inspection, or slaughter hogs (not including sows, bred gilts or boars) weighing 150 to 300 pounds are exempted from the paint marking requirement.
2. Swine for exhibition purposes on permit from the State Veterinarian or his authorized representative.
3. Special sales for breeder swine that have met certain health requirements prescribed by the State Veterinarian and on permit from the State Veterinarian or his authorized representative, and farm-to-farm movement of breeding swine as approved by the State Veterinarian.
4. Farm-to-farm movement of swine within a farming operation as approved by the State Veterinarian.

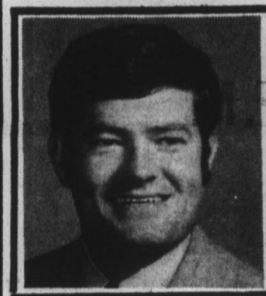
