

Marvin Smith III In New Position

FREDERICK, Md. — J. William Brosius, president, The Langanore Corporation, has announced the appointment of Marvin B. (Jerry) Smith, III, as vice president for sales for Lake Langanore at Eaglehead, the year-around recreational home community now under construction off Route 40, five miles east of here, within commuting distance of Washington and Baltimore.

Smith resigned as vice president for sales of Sea Pines Plantation, Hilton Head Island, S. C., where in the past less than three years he sold about \$20-million in real estate, perhaps the number one performance in the

nation's quality land development field, Brosius said. Age 35 and single, Smith said he joined The Langanore Corporation because he believes the 4,000-acre Lake Langanore community "is similar to Sea Pines Plantation in high standards of architecture, land use planning and natural beauty. Further, Lake Langanore, in my opinion, is right on the threshold of rapid sales and increased land values." To date, individuals have bought more than 1,300 residential sites at Lake Langanore.

A native of Greensboro, N. C., Smith was a member of the U. S. Marine Corps from 1957 to 1959 and was graduated from the University of North Carolina Business School in 1960, with a major in economics. He was a life insurance salesman for three years and then returned to his alma mater to head the public relations and development departments for the undergraduate, masters, doctorate and executive programs for the university's School of Business Administration.

Smith is the son of Mrs. W. B. Rosevear of Pembroke Hall, Edenton, N. C. His late father, Marvin B. Smith, Jr., was executive vice president of Burlington Mills. His late grandfather, Marvin B. Smith, founded Burlington Mills.

Smith's Lake Langanore appointment is effective immediately. He will be totally responsible for all sales, supervising the Langanore sales staff and coordinating marketing activities with an advertising agency and public relations firm. Smith has purchased a site at Lake Langanore and plans to build a home on it as soon as possible.

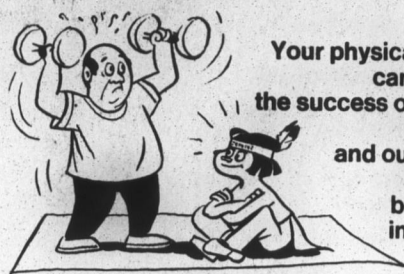
Don'ts for Driving

Boll Weevil Infesting Cotton Fields

Check for Chowan County cotton fields Monday revealed boll weevil infestation and some red spider.

Lindsay Ray Bunch, Rocky Hook, had a field with 28 per cent of the young squares punctured.

Willie Joyner, Ryland, had 9 per cent boll weevil punctured; Cap Ward, Sign Pine, 3 per cent boll weevil damage; Charlie Small, Fahye and Carroll Byrum and Doris Copeland fields were too young for a boll weevil evaluation; Frank White had 0 per cent bolls punctured; Elton Boswell has a heavy infestation of red spider in the field beside his house along the road.

We recommend for boll weevil control that farmers use a mixture of Toxaphene and DDT. Methyl Parathion should be left out of the insecticide since it delays maturity.

For red spiders the control is Azodine. All cotton farmers should check their fields for boll weevil damage and red spider infestations.
