To protect your corn from weevils for the coming year we suggest that if you store your corn, you clean out your bins, spray with premium grade malathion and when you are putting the corn into the bins to store, apply malathion onto the grain as it is going into the auger. This will protect your grain from weevils in the spring of the year and is both cheap and safe to use. If you have questions on the amount or the kind to use on stored grain, contact either the Extension office or your distributor.

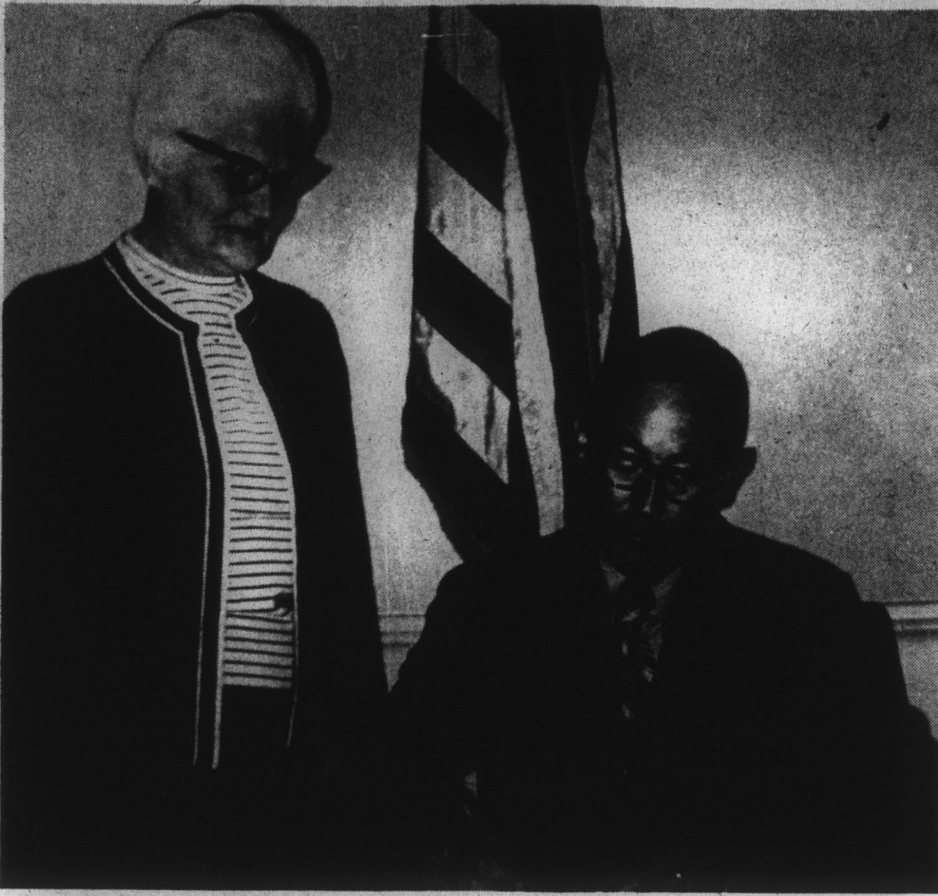

BIGGEST BRIDGE-TUNNEL

N. C. Historical Assets Being Studied

North Carolina's historical assets — in the form of old homes, churches, business buildings, bridges, cemeteries and other properties—are being surveyed and documented by a long-range project within the Department of Art, Culture and History.

Preliminary research already has been done on about 2,000 individual properties, and a more extensive study has been completed on approximately 500. Two hundred thirty-seven North Carolina properties have been listed on the National Register of Historic Places or are awaiting final approval.

The "National Register" is a federal listing set up by the Department of the Interior as a "roll call of the tangible reminders of the history of the United States." Properties are listed on the basis of their historical or architectural significance, and ownership is not affected.

A limited degree of protection is provided in that any federally funded project that would alter or destroy a listed site must be reviewed by the federal government and its importance considered. In addition, a law passed by the

General Assembly in 1971 also requires a review by the N. C. Advisory Council on Historic Preservation when any state-funded or state-licensed project endangers a property on the National Register.

In attempting to record for future generations a broad overflow of the state's history without undue emphasis on the finer plantation homes and mansions, a wide variety of properties have been listed. Representative of the diversification are the Capitol Building in Raleigh, the old Wilkes County Jail where Tom Dula was held for a time, the Cupola House at

Edenton, a historic church in the Trenton, a cotton press in Tarboro, and a turn-of-the-century railroad depot in Hamlet.

The ultimate goal of the survey is to document the significance of every historic property in the state.

Bruce MacDougal, who heads the state's history survey staff of six persons, emphasizes that local people will play a large role in determining the project's success. Without their interest and cooperation in calling attention to significant properties in their areas, the task would be much more difficult.

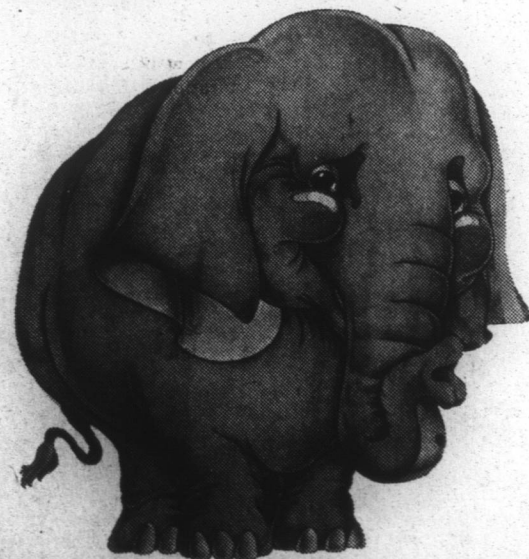
