Order Adopting Schedules of Values, Standards and Rules To Be Used In Appraising Real Property In Chowan County For the 1974 Octennial Appraisal Year

WHEREAS, pursuant to provisions of G. S. 105-286, Chowan County is required to conduct a reappraisal of all real property in the County to become effective for tax assessment purposes, January 1, 1974, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to provisions of G. S. 105-317, county officials are required to develop and compile uniform schedules of values, standards, and rules to be used in appraising real property in the County, which are required to be reviewed and adopted by the Board of County Commissioners, and a copy of the order published in the form of a notice in a newspaper having general circulation in the County, stating in the notice that the schedules, standards and rules to be

in the next scheduled reappraisal of real property have been adopted and that they are open to examination by any property owner of the County at the Office of the Tax Supervisor for a period of ten days from date of publication of notice; and

WHEREAS, the County Commissioners under authority of G. S. 105-299 have employed Allen Appraisal Company of Jamestown, N. C., to assist county officials in developing and compiling uniform schedules and appraisal of real property; and

WHEREAS, uniform schedules of values, standards and rules required by G. S. 105-317 have been developed and presented to the Board of County Commissioners in regular session on September 11, 1972, for review and adoption;

Now, Therefore, Be it hereby ordered by the Board of County Commissioners of Chowan County, in regular session on September 11, 1972:

1. That the Board of County Commissioners hereby adopts the uniform schedules of values, standards and rules developed and compiled with assistance of Allen Appraisal Company for use in reappraisal of real property to become effective for tax assessment as of January 1, 1973.

2. That a copy of this order be published in The Chowan Herald, a newspaper having general circulation in Chowan County, AS A NOTICE that the schedules of values, standards and rules to be used in the scheduled reappraisal of real property to become effective January 1, 1974, have been adopted and that they are open to examination by any property owner of the County at the office of the Tax Supervisor for a period of ten days from the date of publication of this notice.

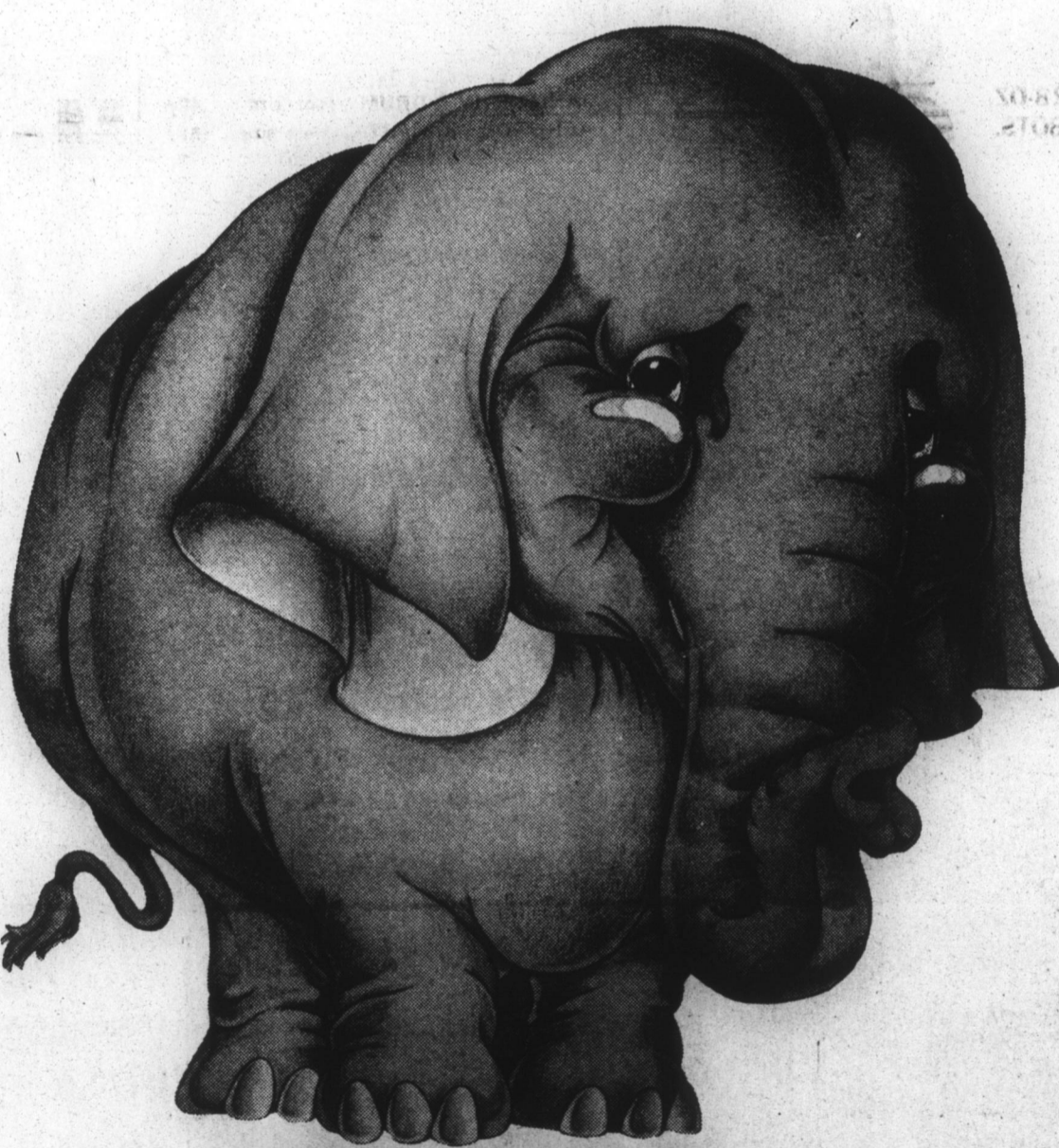
