



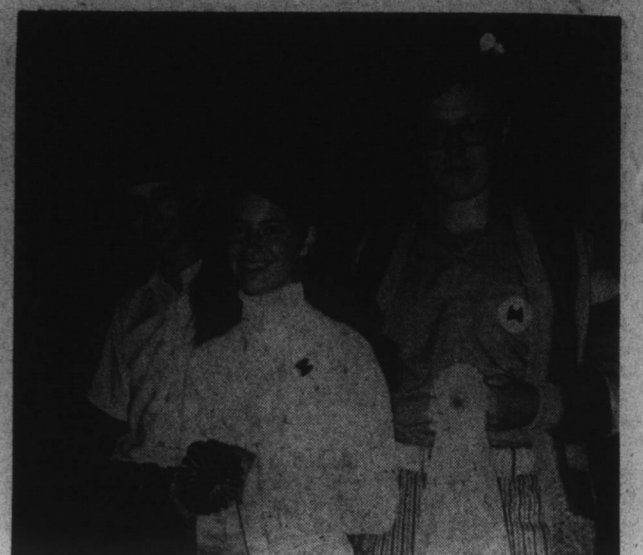

The Tax Books for the year 1972 are now in my hands for the collection of taxes. We urge you to pay your taxes now and avoid the penalty which will begin on January 1.

Interest for failure to pay 1972 taxes (due September 1, 1972) will start on January 1, 1973. (Two percent will be added in January and 3/4 of 1 percent per month thereafter.

Interest on unpaid taxes is increased from 1/2 of 1 percent to 3/4 of 1 percent per month or fraction thereof beginning on the first (not second) day of July, 1972.

Any Taxpayer who cannot pay his or her taxes in one payment can make partial payments until paid. Your cooperation will be greatly appreciated.
