Visit To Area Set By Candidate

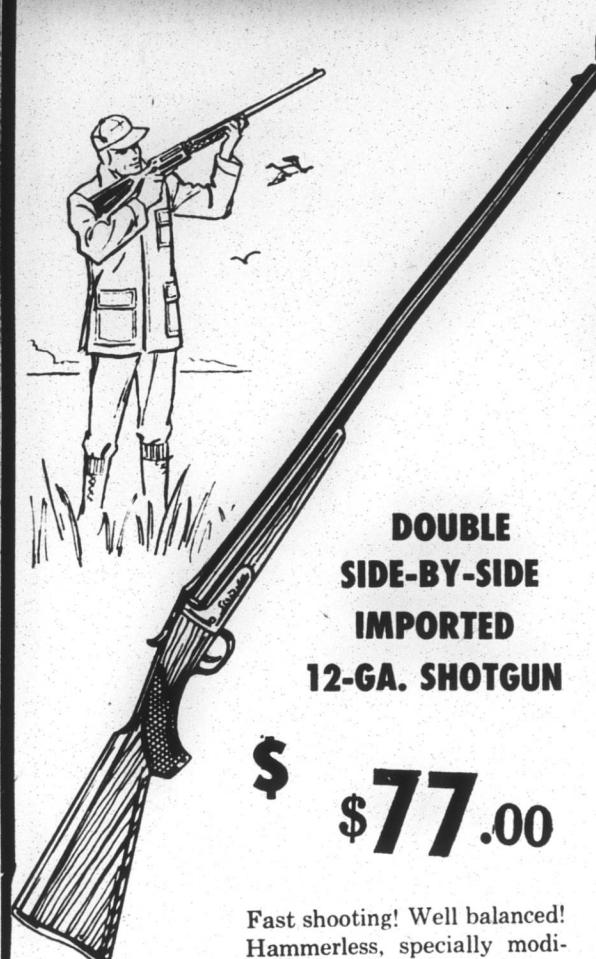
State Rep. John Ingram, Democratic nominee for Insurance Commissioner of North Carolina, is making a swing down East to participate in the 10-county Albemarle Association firemen's parade in Columbia on Saturday.

Rep. Ingram, the only Democrat elected to the General Assembly from the predominantly Republican 27th House District, was the author of House Bill 736 ratifying the 26th amendment giving 18 year olds the right to vote. Under Ingram's bill, North Carolina became one of the 37 states necessary for adoption of the constitutional amendment.

Ingram won his House seat on "issue politics." He promised to work for auto insurance reform and specifically to end discrimination against the youthful safe driver and his parents, who is charged more than a drunk driver over 25. This issue also won him the Democratic nomination for Insurance Commissioner. Rep. Ingram, who is committed to abolish the assigned risk and work in the legislature for a responsible No-Fault, has appealed to the "pocketbook" of voters in all political parties.
