GREENVILLE — R. Frank Everett, Eastern North Carolina coordinator for the Committee to Re-elect the President, has announced the appointment of J. Emmett Winslow of Hertford, as Perquimans County chairman.

Winslow is a former five-term state senator, highway commissioner and sheriff. He was a delegate to the Democratic national conventions in 1952 and 1956.

surface and knead until smooth. Place in a greased bowl. Cover and let rise until double, about one hour. Punch down, divide into parts, shape into ball and place in greased eight-inch pie plates. Cover and let rise until double. Bake at 350 degrees for 40 minutes. If desired, brush with melted butter while still warm. Makes two round loaves.

Flaky Cheese 'N Onion Rolls are real man pleasers. They're made easily from refrigerated crescent dinner rolls. And, they're full of flavor.

Flaky Cheese 'N Onion Rolls
2/3 cup shredded Cheddar cheese.
1 tablespoon instant minced onion.
1/2 teaspoon garlic powder.
1 can refrigerated crescent dinner rolls.
1 egg white, slightly beaten.

1 tablespoon water.
Sesame seed.
Preheat oven to 375 degrees and lightly grease cookie sheet. Combine first three ingredients. Separate crescent dough into four rectangular pieces; press perforations to seal. Combine egg white and water; brush over three rectangles and sprinkle with cheese mixture. Stack the

three rectangles and top with the fourth; gently press rectangles together. Brush with egg white sprinkle with sesame seed. Cut the rectangles in half to form two squares; cut each square diagonally twice to form eight triangles. Place on cookie sheet. Bake at 375 degrees for 10 to 15 minutes until golden brown. Serve hot.
