Grinding Set Aside Land

Land designated for set aside under the 1972 annual programs may be grazed. This land may be grazed up until May 1 of 1973, but no crop can be harvested from this acreage during 1972.

Proven Wheat Yields

Producers may elect to establish a wheat yield based on actual production rather than use the yield established by the county committee on a judgment basis. The base period for establishing 1973 farm yields is 1969, 1970 and 1971. To prove a yield, a producer must have produced wheat on the farm in each of these three years and be able to provide reliable proof of production. In order to assure consideration, a written request should be filed with the county ASCS office within the next 15 days. Production data timely received will

be considered before notification of farm wheat yields. **Lease and Transfer of Tobacco**

Flue-cured tobacco growers may now lease and transfer tobacco quotas through November 30. The basic provisions of the leasing program remain unchanged. All transfers must be within the county. Leasing both to and from a farm is not permitted during the same year. Under the new law both the receiving and transferring farm must have 50 per cent of the effective allotment planted in order to lease or transfer acreage. Farms with less than 2,000 pounds of basic quota may transfer to any eligible farm without regard to the planted acreage on either farm.

Committee Elections

ASC community committee elections for 1973 will be conducted by the mail ballot method with the election date

being December 1, 1972. Ballots will be mailed to all eligible voters on November 20. Nominations will be by petition and the back of the letter mailed to all known eligible voters October 2 can be used for nominating by petition. Petitions must be returned to the ASCS office not later than October 27.

Winter Cover

Assistance is available at the county office at a rate of \$2 per acre for seeding winter cover crops. Fall cover crops require a small investment in time and money but provide a number of benefits. They protect cropland from erosion during the winter months and in spring they can be plowed under to provide organic matter to land on which valuable crops are to be grown. If you have not filed your request, do so now. The final date for seeding cover crops with assistance under the REAP program is November 10, 1972.

Peanut Cards

Peanut marketing cards were mailed to all producers September 28. Producers who did not receive their cards should contact the ASCS office.

Social Security Benefits Over Million Workers

Ninety-six million workers are building protection under social security for themselves and their families. For the young worker and his family, there's continuing protection right now in case of a severe disability or death.

Under the social security disability program, four out of five men and women between 21 and 64 can count on monthly checks if the head of the household is severely disabled and cannot work for a year or more. Ninety-five out of every 100 children under 18, and their mothers, can get monthly social security checks if the family wage earner dies.

For senior citizens, 93 per cent of all the people reaching 65 this year are eligible for

monthly retirement checks from social security. In addition, nearly all of the 21 million persons 65 and over are eligible for Medicare hospital insurance and most are covered by medical insurance as well.

YAMS STATIC

North Carolina farmers who produce almost a third of the nation's supply of sweet potatoes would like to see America's eating habits change to include more yams. The per capita consumption of sweet potatoes has remained almost constant for several years at slightly less than six pounds. A slight drop in consumption of the fresh product has about been offset by a slight increase in processed potatoes.

Despite the similarity in names, acetate and triacetate are two very different fibers. Acetate is sometimes called a "problem" fiber, because it is "weak" and generally not machine washable. Check the label when you buy acetate to see if "dry-clean only" is recommended, advise extension clothing specialists, N. C. State University. Triacetate is washable, however. It can be ironed at a higher temperature than acetate also.
