A separate license and fee shall be obtained for each location or outlet from which restricted-use pesticides are distributed, sold, held for sale, or offered for sale. This provision of the N. C. Pesticide Law applies to those dealers who sell any pesticide ap-pearing on the list of restricteduse pesticides directly to the end user.

Every licensed pesticide dealer shall submit to the Board with each application for an original or renewal license, and at such other times as the Board may prescribe, the names of all perons employed by him who sell or recommend 'restricteduse pesticides.' Each licensed pesticide dealer shall also be responsible for the actions of every person who acts as his employee or agent in the solicitation or sale of pesticides. and in all claims and recommendations for use or ap-

January 1, 1973 is the ef fective date prior to which pesticide dealer licenses must be obtained.
