## Around Chowan Farms By: R. M. THOMI SON.

County Extension C hairman

It is time to plan t soybeans and with the cost of soybean seed this year and also the prospects of the price this fall, much care should be taken. We have several varieties which, if the seed are available, might fit into your farming program. We have the soybeans that mature in October such as Daire. Hood. York and Lee and we have the later maturing varieties such as Ransom and Bragg; that also do quite well. In the past we have planted, in many cases, too many seed to the fcot of row. We suggest 8 to 10 seed per foot of row. This, prevents lodging which in turn reduces yield.

At the present price, in many cases, it is profitable to fertilize soybeans with high potash fertilizer like 3-9-18 or 0-10-20 and if you have not planted soybeans; in the past several years, we suggest that you inocula'te these seed.

Good weed control in soybeans is very necessary. A few big weeds will reduce your yield in soybeans considerably We suggest using chemical herloicides. You have several choices and should use the one to control your biggest problem. This is something you probably should discuss with your dealer or with us. We have available Dynap, Lasso, Dinitro-Lasso, Vernam, Treflan, Maloran, Lorox and early post emergence Tenoran or Norox.
