



211 People Use Stamps

All but three of the 211 people certified to participate in the food stamp program purchased stamps in July. Robert Hendrix, director of the Department of Social Service, reported that participants paid \$7,778.75 and received stamps valued at \$20,674.

Hendrix reported the following other activities: Old Age Assistance: 51 cases, \$3,626 grant, \$71.09 average. Aid to Dependent Children: 76 cases, \$9,434 grant, \$95 average. Aid to Disabled: 47 cases, \$3,396 grant, \$72.25 average. Aid to Blind: 12 cases, \$855 grant, \$71.25 average. General assistance, \$36.59; 22 hospitalized in the county at a cost of \$11,878.40 and four hospitalized outside the county at \$1,311.77, all paid from joint funds. Fifty-eight out-patient services, \$620.03; \$620 from joint funds and three cents from county funds.
