

Panelists Discuss Washington Reports By Walter B. Jones

UFO's Friday

GREENVILLE — Is it likely that there is intelligent life on other planets and is it possible that these beings have visited and may be still observing the planet Earth?

That is the question posed for a panel of guests invited to discuss UFOs (Unidentified Flying Objects) on WNCT-TV's (Channel 9) TOPIC program. The show is scheduled for Friday, at 8 P.M.

The guests include Air Force Capt. Gerald Fabish, assistant professor of Aerospace Studies at East Carolina University; James Rees, assistant professor of drama and speech at ECU; and Dr. Edward Seykora, an ECU physicist. WNCT-TV's Ed Fields and Dr. Leo Jenkins, Chancellor of East Carolina University, are co-moderator of the 30 minute program.

Tax Deadline Is January 15

GREENSBORO — If you are filing an estimated tax return in 1973, you must pay the final installment of tax due by January 15, Charles DeWitt, district director of Internal Revenue said today.

If you first met the requirements for filing an estimate after September 1, you are required to file on Form 1040-ES and pay all of the tax by January 15, 1974. You should file declaration-voucher 4.

If your anticipated income during 1973 has changed, you may be required to amend your declaration, DeWitt stated.

Use the space provided on your estimated tax package to compute an amended estimate.

You can obtain detailed information on "Tax Withholding and Declaration of Estimated Tax," free from your IRS district office. Ask for IRS Publication 505.

During the closing hours of the first session of the 96th Congress, legislation was enacted in an attempt to cope with fuel shortage. The first bill was known as the Energy Reorganization Act of 1973. The purpose of the bill is to bring under the control of a single agency the various government sponsored research and development programs to provide the nation with new sources of energy. The bill provides for the Atomic Energy Commission to be divided into

two components, the Energy Research and Development Agency (ERDA) and the Nuclear Energy Commission (NEC). ERDA will assume all the energy research and development functions, with NEC retaining the nuclear licensing and regulatory functions. The bill provides for the transfer of responsibilities to the newly created central agency from the Department of Interior, relative to the Office of Coal Research including fossil fuel energy R&D and related

power systems and of the technologies to control emissions of pollutants from stationary sources using fossil fuel. It is believed that this consolidated approach to the serious question of shortages can best be handled by one agency rather than three or four separate agencies trying to find solutions. Another legislative hassle developed over the Conference Report regarding the Energy Emergency Act.
