
---0-Sunday School began with a teenage lady, Miss Amanda Bunch, playing the piano

International Sunday School Lesson for December 30, 1973. LESSON TEXT: John 4:1-42.

With this Lesson we start a new unit, but we continue studying the Book of John. Our theme is "The Son of God Active Among Us". Christ Life can be sustained by water in all animalswhether four-footed or twolegged. Bulky foods may be missed, but they can be done without; with water, however, it is a different matter! And - just as Christ has been called the Light of the world, so He represents the water that sustains both the body of man, and the soul. ..and. most importantly...the soul!

Therefore the well-known story of Jesus' encounter with the woman at the well needs no particular stress laid on it's translation Christ was clearly saying "I am the Life"

As the experience relates, Christ was.weary: this should not be surprising to us - it becomes merely demonstration of how completely the Son of God omnipotent in His own right - identified Himself with man. And He, like man, knew the discomfort of thirst
