The purpose of this week's column is to set forth what teachers will be doing on those two days.

It has been written that, "To become a teacher is not only to commit yourself to your students, it is also a committment to yourself to be a continuing learner." With this philosophy in mind, several school systems in Region "R", Edenton-Chowan Schools being one of them, have designated Monday, March 4, as a staff development day for

education. On this day all teachers, kindergarten through 12th grade, will assemble at Northeastern High School in Elizabeth City.

At this time, teachers from different schools and school systems will be afforded the opportunity to: (1) exchange ideas and discuss mutual concerns, and (2) participate in workshop activities designed to strengthen their knowledge, skills and attitudes.
