## Tagged Fish **Worth Money**

It looks like the herring run this year will be a bust, but one herring fisherman had a small piece of luck recently.

Nathan Bridges of Windsor, caught a \$25 herring in the Cashie River with a bow net, according to an official of the N. C. Division of Commercial and Sports Fisheries.

The fish had been tagged 28 days earlier in Croatan Sound by Fisheries Division biologists. The biologists are studying migration habits of the herring. The fish had traveled 83 miles.

The biologists tagged 6,300 herring this season. So far 40 tags have been returned. Rewards for tag returns usually are \$1 each, but there are some \$5, \$10, and \$25 tags.

This is one of the stron presumptions known to the law. and can only be rebutted by irresponsible evidence showing that: (1) the husband was impotent (lacking the capacity for sexual intercourse); or, (2) the husband could not have had access to the mother during the period when conception must have occurred, or, (3) by bloodgrouping tests which indicate that it would have been impossible for the husband to be

the father of the wife's child. In determining what is a "competent time" subsequent to the termination of the marriage, the law has not arbitrarily fixed a cut-off date. It has, instead, created a group of presumptions.

In the absence of evidence to the contrary, it is said that a child born within ten lunar months, or 280 days, after the death of the husband or the granting of a divorce decree is presumed legitimate.'

If a child is born more than ten lunar months, or 280 days, the presumption is that the child is illegitimate.

In a case before the Supreme Court of North Carolina in 1959, a child was born to a woman 322 days after the death of her husband. The woman had not remarried. She testified that the child was the child of her deceased husband, who had died without a will, leaving only personal property.

The Supreme Court said that in the absence of evidence to the contrary, the presumption was that the child was illegitimate and did not inherit any of the personal property of the woman's deceased husband; but that this presumption could to show that the deceased husband was in fact the father of the child.

The burden of proof rested 423,000 upon the child to establish by the greater weight of the evidence that the deceased was the father. The Supreme Court said that the testimony of the wife was sufficient evidence to require the submission of the the question to a jury.

N. C. POULT HATCH UP 26 PER CENT

Heavy breed poults hatched during the week ended April 27, totaled 451,000-an increase of 26 per cent from the 357,000 hatched during the previous week. Eggs set during the week totaled 608,000, an increase of 38,000 eggs or 7 per cent from the previous week. A distinction between heavy and light breed eggs set could not be published this week to avoid disclosing individual

EIGHT STATE HATCH DOWN 6 PER CENT

FROM LAST YEAR In the eight states that have comparable data for the previous year, poults hatched totaled 3,121,000, down 6 per cent from last year and down 7 per cent from the previous week. Heavy breed poults hatched totaled 2,733,000, down 11 per cent from last year and light breeds hatched totaled 388,000, a 52 per cent increase from last season at this time.

Eggs set during the week in the eight states totaled 5,206,000, down 6 per cent from last year but up 4 per cent from last be rebutted by evidence tending week. Heavy breed eggs set numbered 4,783,000, down 8 per cent from last year and light breed eggs numbered a 35 per cent increase from last year.

EGGS SET IN NINE PRINCIPAL STATES UP 4 PER CENT

For the nine principal states, eggs set during the week ended April 27, 1974, totaled 5,814,000, up 4 per cent from the previous week. Total poults hatched in the nine states totaled 3,572,000, down 4 per cent from the previous week. The total hatch included 3,184,000 heavy breeds and 388,000 light breed poults:

# **Caution Urged**

WASHINGTON-The controversy surrounding North Carolina's recently enacted Coastal Management Act has been cited here before a congressional committee as justification for a "go slow" approach to federal land use egislation.

The North Carolina Forestry Association has released a statement presented on its behalf last week to the House Environment Sub-Committee relative to H. R. 10294...the socalled Udall Land Use Bill. The measure would impose stringent controls on the use of private lands throughout the Nation.

John H. Weatherly of Newton, spokesman for the Tar Heel forestry group, urged that field hearings be scheduled on the proposed legislation prior to consideration on the floor of the House. He cited the State's experience during the recently adjourned General Assembly in urging caution.

"As introduced," Weatherly told the congressional subcommittee, "the Coastal Management Act directed policy and authority from the state level. As enacted, the local elected officials will largely determine policy administer provisions of the Act. The issue was state versus local control," Weatherly stressed.

"Local people were appalled to learn that non-elected appointees from one hundred miles away, who owned no local and and paid no local taxes, were going to dictate what was to happen to local owners' property rights. Opposition to that kind of control was vigorous. Response legislators was dramatic,' Weatherly said.

The severe local shortage of gasoline helped spark a flood of legislation concerned with the energy crisis but very little of it was enacted. In fact, of the almost three dozen bills that might be said to be in response to the energy crisis, only five were finally enacted and two of those were resolutions. A new Energy Division was already created within the Department of Military and Veterans Affairs (affirming an already accomplished fact), the Governor was given some additional authority to deal with road blockades, and county and city authority to cooperate in mass transit systems was expanded, but almost every

A new offense of extortion was enacted but the common law crime of suicide was abolished, the effect of which is also to abolish the crime of attempted suicide. An **Inmate Grievance Commission** was created for the Department of Correction, and procedures were established for removing records of misdemeanor drug possession offenses for those under 21 who

A variety of new legislation is concerned with children with particular problems. A commission was established to deal with the problems of children with special needs, as was a council for exceptional children. For juveniles who get into trouble, legislation was enacted to create a system of homes to replace jails as places of detention, and the duties of the Administrative Office of the Courts to provide a uniform system of juvenile probation and aftercare (to be the responsibility of a new division in the AOC) were spelled out.

The revision of the administration of estates statutes finally passed, as did a . new administrative procedure act. The state's tort liability was raised and the statutes on making wine and beer for one's own use were loosened. Use of welfare lists for political purposes was restricted and a statute was added prohibiting the denial of credit to a woman if a man would have received it charge dismissed. Some employers won't hire people unless they have a social security number so students and others planning to get summer jobs should apply for a number now if they don't already have one.

Delaying your application might prevent your employment or cause you to lose time and wages in a job requiring a social security number. When you don't recall having had a social security number before, your application is screened against central files in Baltimore to make sure a second number isn't issued to you-and

screening takes time." You should apply for your social security number at least several weeks before you need it for a job. You can get information about applying by calling, writing, or visiting any
