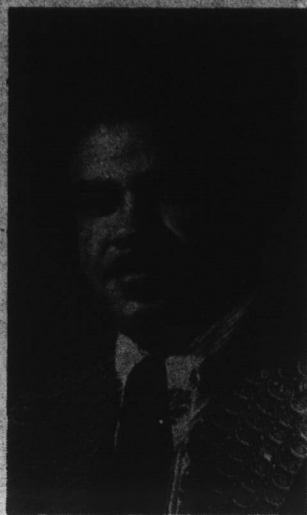
A native of Martin County, she was the daughter of the late Samuel and Mary Pearce Williams. She was the wife of Adrian B. Waterbury, who survives.

Dr. Horton To Address Board At Nags Head

Dr. Larnie G. Horton, special assistant to Gov. Holsouser for minority affairs, will address the board of directors of The North Carolina Rural Fund for Development on Saturday at Nags Head.

The NC-RFD, headquartered in New Bern, provides technical assistance to some 23 separate low-income economic development projects throughout 30 counties of Eastern North Carolina. These include agricultural production and marketing associations, fishery cooperatives, and credit unions whose combined membership exceeds 13,000 persons.

Dr. Horton, prior to his present position with the Governor's office, was president of Kittrell College from 1966-1973. He received his Master of Divinity degree from Duke University School of Theology in 1967 and received an honorary doctorate from National Theology Seminary and College in 1969.

Dr. Horton has been associated with many professional, civic and educational activities. Among these are: member of the board of trustees of Vance County Technical Institute, member of the board of directors of the National Laboratory for Higher Education, member of the board of directors of Soul City Foundation, and member of the American Association of Higher Education.

The many honors bestowed upon Doctor Horton include: Who's Who in American Colleges and Universities, Woodrow Wilson Fellow, Rockefeller Fellow, and Who's Who in the South and Southwest.

Doctor Horton was voted one of America's Outstanding Young Men in 1970.
