

Commissioners' Proceedings

Due to the first Monday in September falling on a holiday the Board of County Commissioners held its regular meeting Monday, September 9th, 1974, at 9 o'clock A.M. in the County office building with all members present: C. A. Phillips, Chairman; C. M. Evans, David T. Bateman, N. J. George, Alton G. Elmore.

Commissioner Evans gave the invocation. Chairman Phillips called the meeting to order. The minutes were amended to read "Soil Conservation Supervisor" instead of "Soil Conservation Service" in a motion made in the previous meeting. Upon motion of Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Bateman and unanimously carried, that the minutes of the previous meeting be approved as corrected. On motion of Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner Bateman and unanimously carried, that the bills be paid.

Upon motion of Commissioner George, seconded by Commissioner Bateman and unanimously carried, that County will furnish legal counsel to represent Sheriff's Department in any legal action brought against the Department as result of conduct of the Department's legal responsibilities.

Upon motion of Commissioner George, seconded by Commissioner Evans and unanimously carried, that the Commissioners endorse the request of the Sheriff's Department that the highway patrol headquarters remain in Elizabeth City.

On motion of Commissioner George, seconded by Commissioner Elmore and unanimously carried, that Chairman Phillips be authorized to sign a letter endorsing the proposal being submitted by Alliance for Progress, Inc.

On motion of Commissioner Elmore, seconded by Commissioner

George and unanimously carried, that the Board of Commissioners endorse and support the pending Amendment to Chapter V of the North Carolina Constitution. The Industrial Revenue Bond Amendment.

Whereas, on April 8, 1974, The North Carolina General Assembly did ratify and enact, by votes of 103 to 4 and 39 to 3, Chapter 122 of the Session Laws of North Carolina, and

Whereas, this act amends Chapter V of the Constitution of the State of North Carolina so as to authorize the issuance of Revenue Bonds to finance industrial facilities, including pollution control facilities, and

Whereas, this act provides that the amendment is to be submitted to the qualified voters of the State on November 5, 1974, in the form that will allow a vote for or against...constitutional amendment to create jobs and employment opportunities and to protect the environment by authorizing the issuance of Revenue Bonds to finance industrial and pollution control facilities... and

Whereas, this method of financing is now available to industry in forty-eight of fifty states, and

Whereas, the cost of adequate treatment to all types of pollution discharge continues to increase and the North Carolina Industrial Revenue Bond financing has become a widely respected and established method of obtaining funds at attractive interest rates and on an attractive term of payment; and

Whereas, this method of financing is not available to the citizens of North Carolina's existing manufacturing community; and North Carolina's Communities are not able to choose whether or not they will offer prospective or existing employers the method of financing existing in surrounding states; and

Whereas, these conditions represent an intolerable competitive disadvantage to North Carolina Industry and to North Carolina Communities who want to do this type of financing; and

Whereas, The North Carolina Association of County Commissioners, at their annual meeting in August of 1974, did adopt a resolution endorsing this change to the North Carolina Constitution; and,

Now Therefore Be It Resolved that the Chowan County Board of Commissioners do endorse and support pending Amendment to Chapter V of the North Carolina Constitution.

On motion of Commissioner Evans, seconded by Commissioner George and unanimously carried, that the Tax Collector be relieved of \$23.80 Thomas E. Bateman double listed for 1974; Tax receipt no. 23. Also relieve Tax Collector of \$35.48 Glenn W. Estes and wife - error in listing, 1974; Tax Receipt no. 79.

On motion of Commissioner Bateman, seconded by Commissioner Evans and unanimously carried, that 1974 County-wide taxes in the amount of \$686,419.67 be charged to the Tax Collector for collection; also turn over for collection excess taxes when valuations are received from State Board of Assessment.

On motion of Commissioner George, seconded by Commissioner Bateman and unanimously carried, that County Coordinator be authorized to amend budget to include amount to pay janitor to work necessary hours.

On motion of Commissioner Bateman, seconded by Commissioner Evans, that the Landfill Committee be authorized to employ an additional person. Three voted in the affirmative; one negative vote. The motion was carried.

On motion of Commissioner Elmore, seconded by Commissioner Bateman and unanimously carried, accepting \$6,000.00 under the Emergency Employment Act Program; also initiate building inspecting assistance to the County.

On motion of Commissioner George, seconded by Commissioner Bateman and unanimously carried, that L. F. Amburn, Jr., be appointed a member to represent Chowan County on Coastal Resources Advisory Council.

On motion of Commissioner Elmore, seconded by Commissioner Evans and unanimously carried, that the County co-sponsor an ad in the Chowan Herald on Constitution Week; amount of \$71.00.

On motion of Commissioner Elmore, seconded by Commissioner George and unanimously carried, that a formal request be made to the Town of Edenton to endorse the Bond Referendum for the County-wide Water System.

The following reports were accepted and ordered filed: Tax Collector, County Coordinator, Rescue Squad, Social Services, Agr. Extension Service, Finance Director, Animal Control Officer, Veterans Officer, Jail report, Sheriff's Dept., Edenton-Chowan Schools.


All four schools felt that the program was a great success and very helpful to the students.
