NCSU Enrolment Sets New Mark

Men and women from 99 of the state's 100 counties, 46 other states, and 68 other countries have joined to give N. C. State University its largest enrollment in history.

The students, majoring in the sciences, technologies, humanities and arts taught at NCSU, total 15,751, according to final registration statistics.

That total is 1,500 above the enrollment of a year ago.

There are 30 students from Chowan County attending the university.

The students come from homes as near to the campus as a block away and from places as distant as Hawaii, Afghanistan, Sierra Leone and Singapore.

Of the total, 4,093 are women students, who for many years were a rarity at NCSU.

Another record figure came from the graduate students who are working for masters and doctoral degrees. A total of 2,615 students are enrolled in the Graduate School.

A heavy majority of the students at NCSU are North Carolinians—13,587. But the reputation of NCSU across the nation and around the world also attracted students from 46 other states, the District of Columbia, four American territories and 68 other countries.

Less than 3 per cent of the junior and senior class students nationwide are awarded this recognition.

Knovack plans to attend either Howard University, Washington, D.C., Winston-Salem State University, or University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and major in political science and/or pre-law upon graduation in June.
