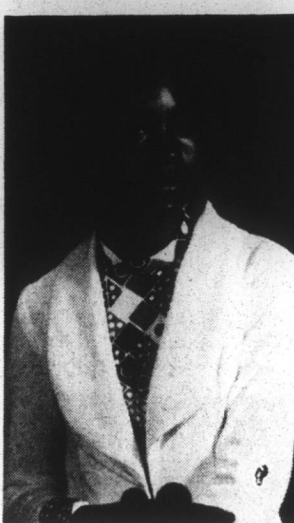

Anyone wanting to learn to use the pressure canner to can vegetables this summer may come to a workshop in the extension kitchen on Wednesday at 2 P.M. and May 7 and 14 at 2 P.M.

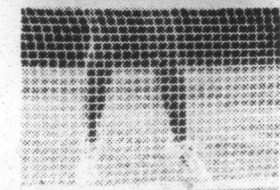
This will give you a chance to learn how to use the canner. The extension office has three canners we loan to people to use.

Remember that all low acid vegetables should be canned only in a pressure canner. These vegetables are beans, corn, squash, limas, beets, etc. that should be canned under pressure—the only way you can get the heat to the center of the jar high enough to cook the food—to make it safe to eat.

Remember too that you can get your pressure canner lid checked free at the Foods Festival in the Edenton Armory on April 29 and 30, 10 A.M. to 7 P.M. each day.
