people to turn against him. When the people turned on him, he was sent to the city of Caesarea, a beautiful city where the governor lived. This is where Felix lived. He perhaps is a symbol of the arch politician -talked out of both sides of his mouth crooked as a person could be. By his devious ways, he had moved himself from slavery to a position of great importance. He was a gentile but had his eye on Drusilia, a Jewess, and managed to get her away from her husband.

Is there hope for a person like this? I believe there is if he confesses his sins and accepts Jesus as Lord and

Felix, with his wife Drusilia, sent for Paul and heard him concerning faith in Christ. Paul did not argue - he reasoned with him about the sensibility, success and victory of doing things right. Righteousness and godliness go together.

How do we become right with God? "STRUGGLE" is the title of a file that I have about getting my life into a right plane with God. It's worth every bit of the struggle to get right with God. Paul was talking to two people whose lives were very wrong because he wanted them to get right with God. Temperance was the next

point brought out by Paul. Temperance in ALL things, including temper, eating and dealing with people particularly today, in race relations. Recently, during school recess, a man came into the playground and began to blow up colorful balloons for the children, who had a great time floating them in the air. The bell rang and children ran back into the building except for one little black boy. He asked "Mister, if you blew up a black balloon, would it float?". The man looked at the small boy who had questioned him and said 'It's not the color of the balloon that makes it float, it's what's inside".

Paul's next point was Judgement. Judgement goes on all the time. If you don't paint your house, it begins to peel; if we don't keep our minds active, they'll become stale. God will judge us according to every secret thing that we do. He will hold us accountable for every word we speak contrary to his will. We cannot escape judgement. Felix almost decided to go "Jesus Declares His Christ's way. The devil said 'Don't do it". He let the moment slide, the devil moved in and Felix never, that adult Christians never found that "convenient day".

We must become like putty in God's hands. Let Him "break up the ground". of our lives into "fallowed ground" and plant seeds of righteousness in us so there will be victory in our lives and no matter what the circumstances, we will be so in tune with God that we will be happy and can turn that which is evil into something
