

Barclift Jailed For Drunk Driving

Donald Lee Barclift was given an 18-month active prison term in Chowan County District Court on April 26 after being convicted of five traffic violations, including third offense of drunk driving. Judge John T. Chaffin also found Barclift guilty of failure to stop for a blue light, resisting arrest, no operator's license and reckless driving. The defendant gave notice of appeal.

Greens are a valuable addition to the diet. They are high in vitamins A and C, as well as the important minerals calcium and iron.

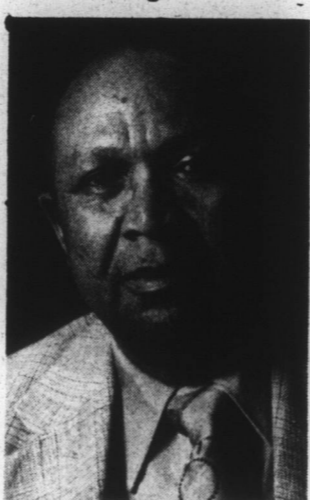
Roads Council Orangutang Circus Feature

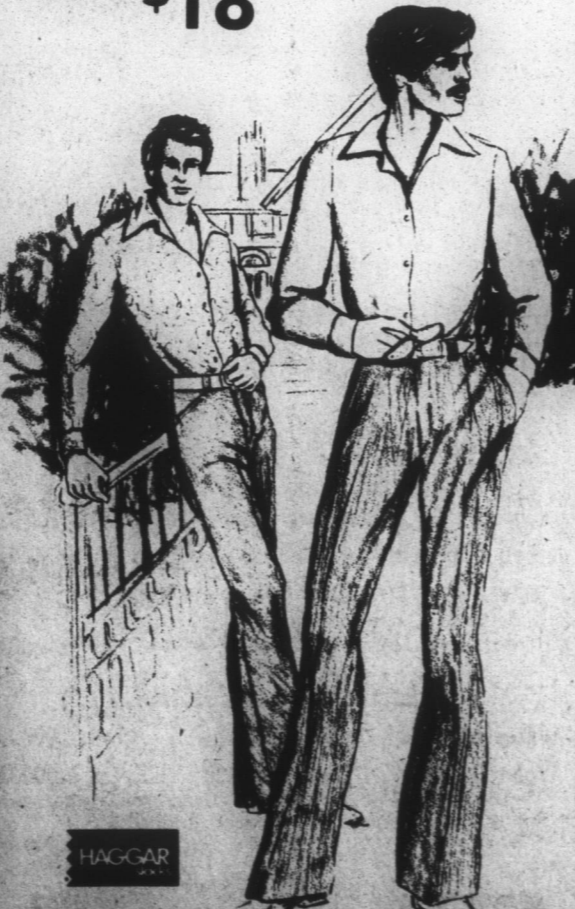
